Round-trip travel expenses and livelihood expenses during your stay in China will be borne by us. I trust that your visit: to China will be helpful towards promoting mutual understanding and friendship between the people of China and Japan. Kindly favor us by sending us a roster of the delegation and period of stay in our country as soon as possibly by wire for that will facilitate us in our arrangements.

The tolegram inviting from Communist China inviting former soliders as previously promised to former Lt Gen ENDO Saburo, who visited Communist China last fall, was received from CHANG Hsi-jo (1728/1153/5387) of the Chinese People's Foreign Affairs Icademy (Chukoku Jimmin Gaiko Gakai) on 19 March.

The telegram stated, "We would like to dispatch (TN: prob means "have dispatched") about thirty persons by early May, for the promotion of Sino-Japanese friendship. Travelling expenses and excenses in China will all be borne by China." ENDO on 20 March asked the Kaiko Kai (dimits Director General: INAMURA Hitoshi), an organization of former soldiers, to nominate twenty former soliders. Also, ten will apparently be chosen from the group close to ENDO.

The Kaiko Kai is choosing persons in conference with the Nippon Senyu Dantai Rengo Kai and the Suiko Kai), and it appears that they will assemble a relatively broad representative, with 3 general officers, 12 field-grade officers, and 5 company-grade officers.

ENDO is naming conditions, such as that although all expenses will be borne by China each person should prepare about \$20,000 worth of presents, and that in the selection of personnel, they should be (a) neutral persons and (b) persons not engaged in business. (TN: Text says shobai ni yukanai)

This year also, international exchange between the Communist line, particualry the WFTU, and Japanese labor circles, has been active, and KAWASAKI Natsu attended the "International Mothers Committee" (Kokusai Haha ya Iinkai) meeting on **Essenticuary** 3-4 February, and YAMAGUCHI Kenji attended the meeting of the executive committee of the World Federation of Democratic Youth held in Helsinki on 1-4 February.

Then on 6 Earch an invitation was received addressed to Chairman FUJITA of Sohyo from the USSR and Communist China to attend their May Day celebrations, and the group is deciding to inspect China and the USSR after attending the celebrations for an estimated into three weeks.

Also, the Chinese Communist Labor Union League sent invitations at the same time, besides the above, for 3 from Zenro Kaigi, 2 from Sodomei, 1 from Sambetsu Kaigi, 1 from Shin Sambetsu, 2 from Kankoro, 2 from Zen Kotsu, and 1 from Zen Shokyo.
