SHIGEKANA desires to become a member of the Japanese delegation to the Japan Trade Fair tentatively scheduled to be held in Peiping in the spring of 1956, through negotiations with Japanese firms concerned. He claims he is already in touch with Japanese firms who will help him in this respect, and also claims to have sources from which he can get the necessary funds for the trip. In discussions between SHEGEKANA and two of the ChiCom Trade Fair delegates, FAN Chi-wen and WANG Chao-yuan, SHIGEKANA expressed his concern as to whether the ChiCom govt would give him an entry visa in view of his background. SHIGEKANA claims that FAN and WANG assured him that his past background would not be a deterrent as the Chi People's Covt welcomes people who know China well, irrespective of their pre-war background or activities. (Source Comment: It is interesting to note that what SHIGEKANA said coincides with the recent invitation to ex-Lt. General ENDO Saburo to visit China.) (Fld Comment: Our f les how that ex-Lt. Gen ENDO Saburo was a member of a goodwill mission to China in Nov-Dec 1955, sent by the People's League for Safeguarding the Constitution, and headed by Former Premier KATAYAMA Tetsu.

* * * COMMENT: Kokuminrengo grew out of an organisation called the Asian Antiwar League (Ajia Fusen Domei) which was organised by KATAYAMA Tetsu, HARA Takeshi (Left wing Socialist) and KAZAMI Akira. Then KATAYAMA became dissatiafied with the Anti-war League's lack of progress, he organised a "Conference for the Protection of the Peace Constitution" in April 1953, supported by ARITA Hachiro, UNNO Shinkichi and SEDO Saburo (a former Lt. Gen). This Minusaman "Conference" was the beginning of the present organisation. The League points out that himmans "Japan's" military buildup, which already has resulted in wreaking the "public welfare budget, is being purhed chiefly by the U.S. The movement to protect the Peace Constitution is the result of popular protest against the expansion of Japan's armed forces". At the insistence of the Right-Hing Socialist Party, the Japanese Communist Party was excluded from the league; however at least one Communist led organisation, the National Students Self-Government Pederation was permitted to join, * * *
