Please provide us with [Redacted] date and place of birth, and citizenship status. Without this data, we may be unable to distinguish between individuals with the same or similar names.

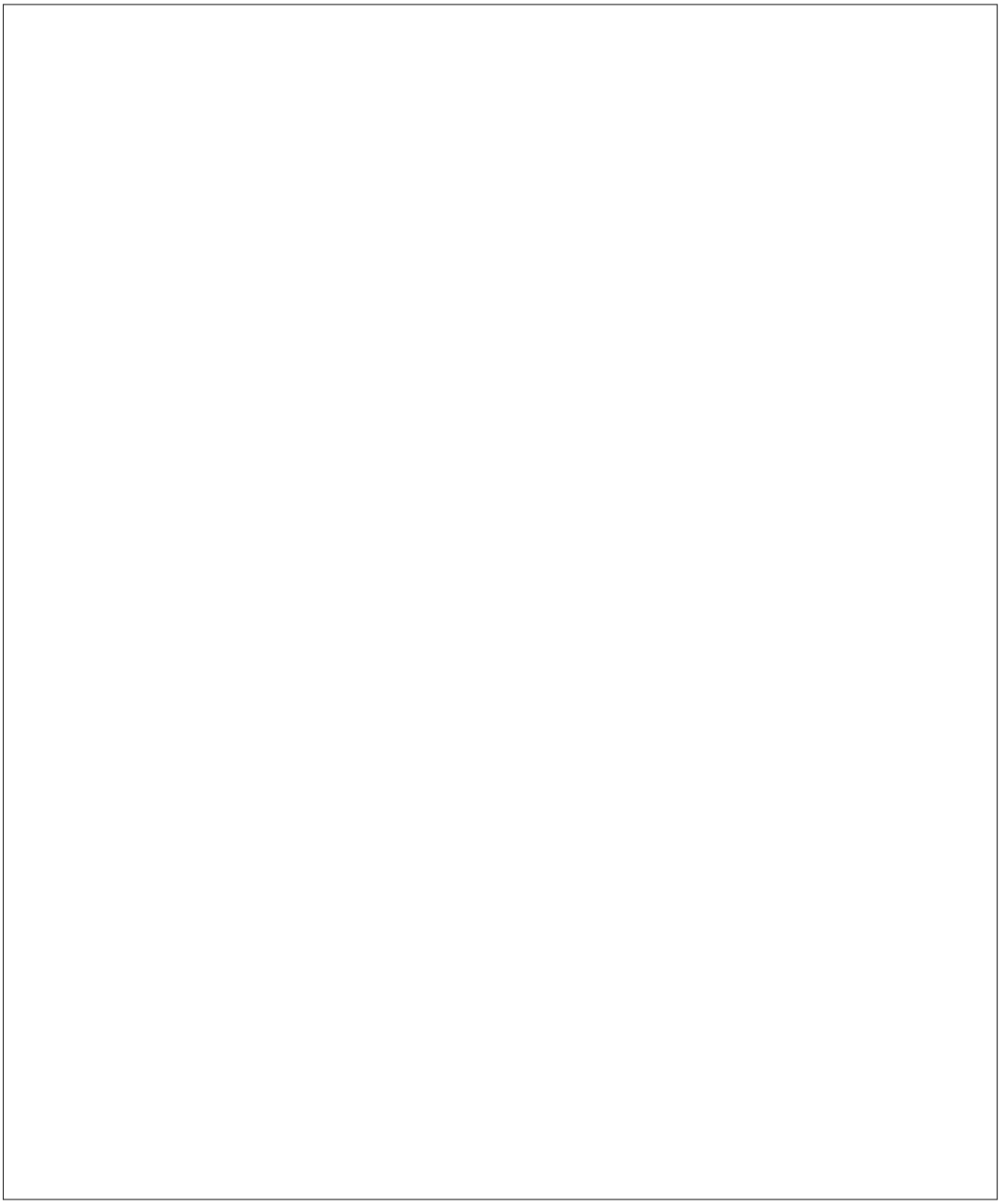
If the person is deceased, we need some evidence of death, such as a death certificate, an obituary, or press statement, so that we can be sure there are no privacy considerations. We can search without this evidence, but if we should locate relevant records and did not have such evidence, we would have to withhold information that, if released, would be an unwarranted invasion of that person's privacy. Privacy rights are addressed in the Privacy Act (5 U.S.C. § 552a) and the FOIA (5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(6)).

We will hold your request in suspense for 45 days from the date of this letter pending receipt of the biographic information and proof of death mentioned above.
