## IBRAHIM FARKA

Born in Tirana on August 14, 1910. Son of Handi Farka end Qamile Shehi.

Elementary school in Tirana. Secondary studies in Rome, Italy.

?726 to 1928, Military School of Rome, from which he graduated as a lieutement of artillery.

1929-1980, four courses for efficer's qualification.

1980-1982, Commander of the first 75/18 field artillery battery, then stationed in Berat, with the Commanda Division, with the rank of Captain, until the Fascist invasion.

On the invasion of Albania by the Fassists, he fought against the occupier for a few days, then left the country on April 12, 1989, for Jugoslavia. On 30 September, 1989, the Jugoslavs intermed him in the city of Yrac and kept him there until 5 April, 1941.

On 6 April, 1941, when the Germans attacked Jugoslavia, Farka, with the other Albanians, crossed once more the Albanian frontier and fought in the region of Scutari against the Pascists and the Germans, who were advancing.

On 12 June he was obliged to return to Jugoslavia, where he was arrested by the Germans in February, 1942, and handed over to Italian authorities in Belgrade. Then he was intermed in Signa.

On the formation of the Kruja government in April, 1942, Farka returned to Albania.

From 1945 to 19 November, 1944, Farka was under the leadership of Abas Kupi with the maticulaist forces in central Albania.

On 21 Movember, 1944, he left Albania and came to Italy, where he has lived ever since.

He is a member of the National League of Farmers and Peasants.

He is a member of the General Committee of the MCFA.
