Interpretations of intelligence information in this publication represent immediate and preliminary views which are subject to modification in the light of further information and more complete analysis.

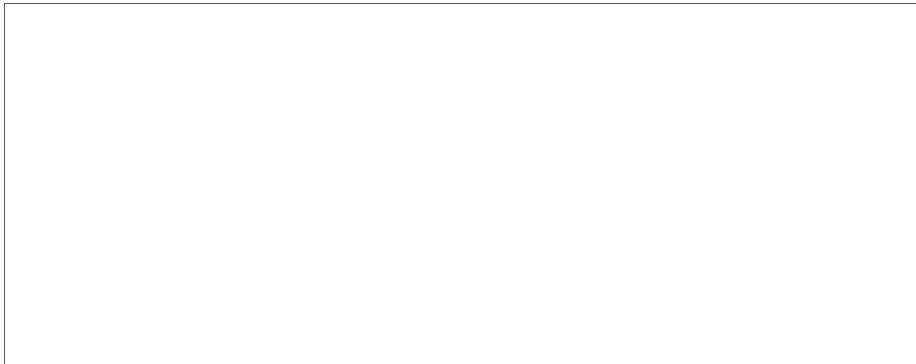
Certain intelligence items in this publication may be designated specifically for no further dissemination. Other intelligence items may be disseminated further, but only on a need-to-know basis.

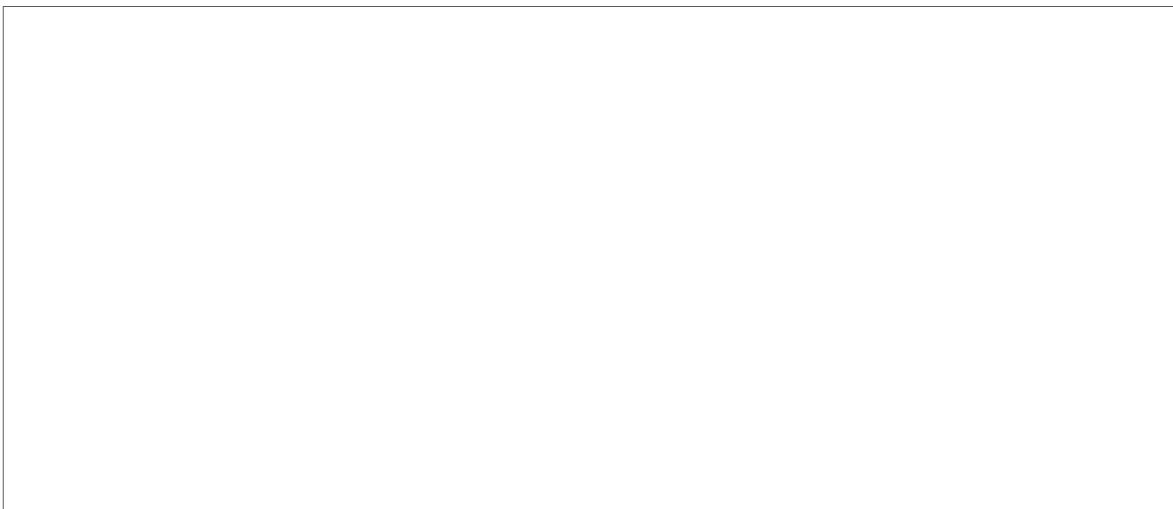

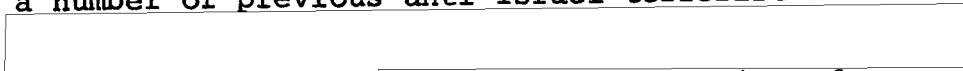

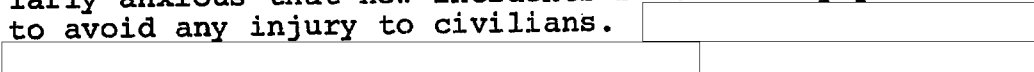

Fedayeen: George Habbash's Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine (PFLP), responsible for a number of previous anti-Israel terrorist incidents

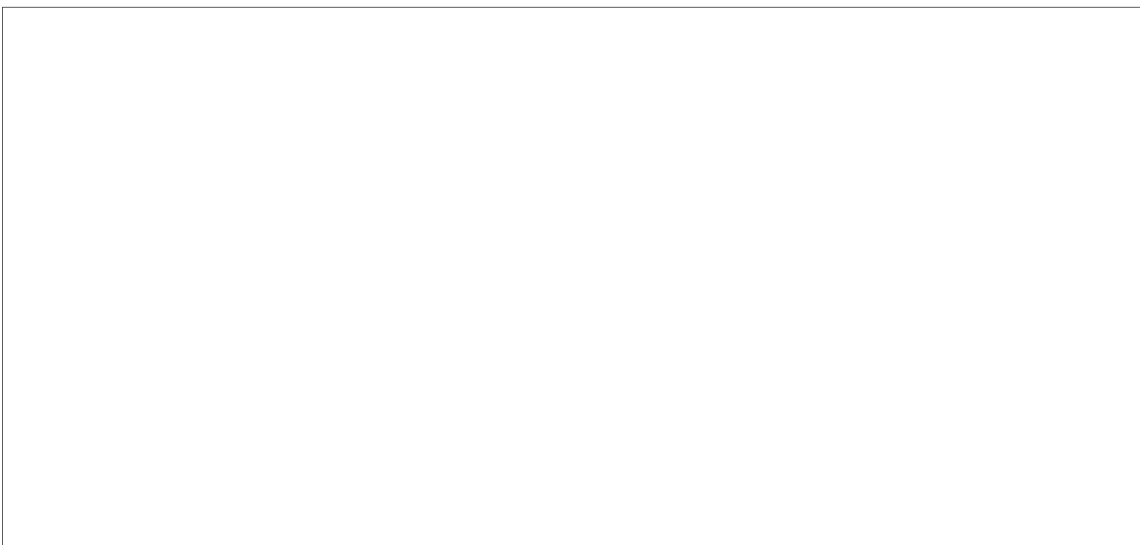


The PFLP does not intend to drop its activities altogether but recognizes that the heavy airline security precautions now in effect will make future operations more difficult. Habbash, possibly as a result of the worldwide outcry against the Swissair crash, is said to be particularly anxious that new incidents be carefully planned to avoid any injury to civilians.
