Legation advised that one time head of German Gestapo in Sweden August Finke is still alive. Information obtained by Legation contact who was known to Finke from wife of Finke who is still in Sweden. During past few days Mrs. Finke heard from her husband who may be in Denmark.

Apparently Finke is taking the name of Dr. Otto H.V. Lensz, or Lentz or Lenz, with first name of Waldemar. Dr. Lenz was formerly connected with A.B. Radio Mundial. On behalf of Ribbentrop he visited Sweden in 1941 and was connected with A.B. Belgo Baltic and Bensen A.B. Pennco. Also with Adrien Schoeck, a Dane, who worked in various countries for Radio Mundial. See Proclaimed List files and files of Belgo Baltic for information on Lenz.

Hope of Finke is to return to Sweden to work for Belgo Baltic or Pennco. OSS has above information and is checking with Army authorities in Denmark and elsewhere in Europe.

Germans are removing certain confidential records from Stockholm to Berlin according to Finke's statement to Legation's source of information. Finke has gained some notoriety lately in the Swedish press as the head of the Gestapo in Sweden.

Dr. BOTTIGER, "Volkischer Beobachter" correspondent in STOCKHOLM, is reported to have made frequent reports to FINKE. Both are listed under heading of German Legation officials or newspaper correspondents who are known to have been working for the German Intelligence Services; (by a German who was engaged in German propaganda but who denies having any connection with intelligence or subversive activity who was interviewed 6 Jul 45).

Since this would have ruined the Amt VI network, attempts were made to have Ribbentrop intercede with the Swedish Government. The Germans were able to offer an exchange. They had picked up the Swedish agent after he had left his briefcase with a large number of reports in the Propaganda Ministry. Kaltenbrunner had these reports photostated and translated and found that they contained excellent material on the Luftwaffe and on atom-splitting experiments. The deal with Sweden failed but the Germans allowed the Swedish network to continue operation, in hoping it may be working for Russia and a larger catch could be made.

From former German Intelligence Officer - rated F-0 from M/A Sweden - the following is reported:
"Talking of German activities in Stockholm, source - above - name not given -- quoted in my cable No. 510-31 May, 1945, states that several weeks ago, German Leg. employee and agent AUGUST FINCKE, while walking on street here, was lightly dusted with white powder apparently inadvertently by a passerby. Following day an inflammation developed in one eye and progressed rapidly until sight was gone. A German eye specialist to whom FINCKE turned for treatment, was unable to identify the powder. Source had no theory regarding perpetrator.

Finke apparently hopes to come to Sweden to be employed by Belgo Baltic or Penn Co. It is not known whether Finke is still in Denmark. Above information has been known to OSS here which has called for check to be made by Army authorities in Denmark and other European areas.

With a view to clarifying the recent decree forbidding all further public appearances of Remer and of unspecified speakers of SRP activist groups, the Ministry of the Interior has now published a list containing thirteen further names. These include the more notorious, Franz Richter, (Bundestag member), the Land chairman of the SRP, August Finke, von Bothmer, Dr. Gerhard Krueger (who continued to be a prominent speaker although under the provisions of the law in Category III Nazi) and two Landtag members. Member of NSDAP, Nov 1931-May 1945; Allgemeine SS, Nov 31-May 45, reaching the rank of Obersturmbannführer (lt.col.), 1944. Member of SD of the SS, Sept 35-May 45, reaching the grade of Oberregierungsrat in 1944. Member of Auslandsnachrichtendienst of SD, Nov-Dec 1935-May 45, in which he was first concerned with drawing up plans for the establishment of the SD intelligence service abroad. In 1938 his department became Amt IV of the RSHA. In May 1942 assigned to Stockholm as assistant to German Commercial Attache for the purpose of setting up a branch of the German intelligence service in Sweden. Was withdrawn (or expelled) from Stockholm, Feb 45, as he had become too well known and was openly described in the Swedish press as the head of the Gestapo in Sweden. Arrested in Copenhagen, June 26, 45; transferred to No. 6 CIC on May 30, 46; placed in Category III by German Spruchkammer

on November 26, 1947. Released from No. 6 CIC on December 16, 1947.

Gienanth claimed that in Stockholm, as in Washington, he engaged in no "extra-curricular" activities, and that he had no connections with the SD there or with any of his work. He admitted, however, that he often saw August FINKE, the SD chief in Stockholm and representative of Amt VI of the Reichsicherheitshauptamt (RSHA). Finke was, Gienanth said, an old SS man like himself and hence they were friendly. He had, however,

no connection with Finke's work and consulted him officially only when, for example, he (Gienanth) was appealed to by the German Consul General in Stockholm to assist in obtaining visas particularly in cases involving Swedish wives of Germans. In such cases, Gienanth said, he went to Finke who, by reporting to Walter SCHELLENBERG, Chief of Amt VI of RSHA in Berlin, could expedite arrangements. Gienanth's only other contacts with Finke in the line of business were that Finke did not attend the Legation's daily "press conferences", and consequently asked Gienanth several times a week to come to his office and report on them, since he was interested in the "political opinions expressed by the Minister, Counselor and other members of the Legation Staff". Gienanth claimed that his reports to Finke, however, were only to inform the latter regarding the general political trend, and did not in any way constitute reports on the personal political attitude of the officials involved. He never, he declared, denounced his colleagues to Finke or anyone else for "negative" or "defeatist" remarks or views. One reason for this was purely "egotistical", he rather naively remarked, since he wished as soon as possible to enter the regular Foreign Service and knew that he would not be able to do so if he had ever reported on career officers.

completely overshadowed by the presence of the Federal Committee in
Hanover, which deals directly with the three party districts in
Niedersachsen, the East under

WILHELM, Kurt, the West under

HEINER, Gerhard, and the South with a leader yet to be named.

Reports have become more frequent of splits in the SRP ranks primarily
due to the clashing of personalities rather than differences over
policy. Two directly-elected Landtag members have left the party,

SCHEIDT, Ernst, to become a member of the FDP, and more recently
WESER, Franz, who is at present an independent. The latter departed
in a cloud of accusations and counter-accusations. He stated that he
was not the only party member who is disgusted with the leadership of
von Westarp, Dorls, and Remer. A more significant development is the
rupture between

von WESTARP, Wolf, and

KRUEGER, Gerhard, despite their protestations and sworn bonds of
comradeship. Von Westarp's ambition and inability to suffer opposition
make him a difficult man to work with. Krueger as editor of the SRP

organ, "Deutsche Opposition", retaliates by avoiding reference to von
Westarp in the paper while emphasizing the activities of other party
leaders. Such personality clashes would seem to be inevitable in a
situation in which the top men all strongly endorse the "Fuehrer
prinzip", and each envisages himself as the strong man.
