and his father is now deceased. He stated that his mother is MARY DURBAN, was MARY PASCH; present address: East Flanders Street (Street number(unknown) Portland, Oregon. PASCH advised that his mother lived at 2343 West Belmont, Phoenix, Arizona prior to moving to Portland. FASCH advised that prior to being deported from the United States in June or July 1934, he was married to MAXINE PASCH, nee: FOSTER and was divorced from her. PASCH stated that he had a daughter JOAN PASCH by that marriage who is presently residing with her mother at Dast 15th Street, Portland, Oregon. PASCH added that he is presently married to ELSA PASCH, German National, who lives at Amburg, Altona, Gilbert Street 21, Germany. The undersigned inspected PASCH'S passport which disclosed the following information: Passport No. 772/54; Deutsch No. 1821231; issued to AUGUST WILHEIM PASCH, born 14 April 1913, on 13 September 1954 at the German Consulate, San Francisco, California. (PASCH advised that he reason the passport was not issued in Germany was due to the fact that he had lost a passport that had been issued in Germany.

PASCH advised that he was raised in the United States since the year 1922 and his address prior to being deported to Germany in June or July of 1934 ias 695 East 11th Street, Portland, Gregon.

PASCH advised that prior to being deported from the United States in une or July 1934, he had been employed by BOB XVANS who was a bootlegger and he PASCH) was involved in a robbery with three (3) other men and the victim was illed and he was charged with manslaughter. PASCH advised that he was also charged ith two (2) charges of bank robbery and was deported to Germany for having committed criminal act. PASCH stated that during the year 1934, he was convicted of larcent y a German Court, and was sent to prison in Hamburg, Germany. PASCH advised that 3 metRICHAND MEADES, author of "Cut of The Night" (pen name JAS (VALTIN) in this ison and at that time Charles told him that he (CRARES) had been deported to Gormany om the United States after having been convicted of robbery in San Francisco, Lifornia during the year 1925 or 1929. Philliphicated that CRAES told him the cident was actually an assault for political reasons however was passed oif as a bbery. FASCH advised that the dermans allowed CHADES to escape from this prison . 1935 in order that FRAMES could act as an informant for the Germans. liberated by American Forces on 3 May 1945. PASCH stated that he told the Americans his story and gave them his correct name. He was then issued a pass and a vehicle and was told to drive it to Hamburg, Germany and deliver it to the Fritish Military Government. PASCH stated that he did this and was not held by the Allies. PASCH stated that from 1945 to 1946 ne worked as an interpreter for the Royal Navy (British) and in the first part of 1946 he stowed away on a ship and went to England where he remained for awhile. He stowed away or another ship and went to Cuba. He advised that he spent approximately ten (10) months in Cuba, stowed away on another ship and went to Miami, Florida, where he entered the United States and was caught by American officials and received a six (6) month sentence in the Federal Prison in Tallahassee, Florida. PASSH stated that he escaped from this prison approximately thirty (50) days before his time was up as he had told the officials that he was FRED FAILEY, a solitish subject from Singapore and he did not want to be deported to Singapore. PASCII stated that he was recaptured in Jacksonville, Florida; was tried for escape in the Federal Court of Tallahassee end was sentenced to a year and a day. FASCH stated that he served his sentence; told the officials his true identity and was deported to Germany in February 1949. PASCH advised that he has been in the Merchant Marine since that date.

PASCH stated that FREEDENCE FELLENEERG, Burgemeister of a term in the Eastern Sector of Germany, had, on three (3) or four (4) occasions, the most recent being approximately three (3) years ago, offered him Five Hundred Thousand Marks to kidnap FNU/GERLER (Phonetic), a former German General and presently employed by the United States Government as a key interligence official, and to turn him over to the Eussians and it he could not capture GEHLEN, to kill him.

PASCH stated that while he was in Hamburg, Germany on approximately 15 February 1956, he visited the office of Arbeits Amt in an attempt to find out why he had not received his "unemployment money" for the past five (5) weeks. FASCH auvised that he was referred to FNU\DZUBER who is the head of all the German employment agencies, namely, Arbeits Amt (Besenbenderhoff), Hamburg, Germany. PASCH stated that he was very surprised to see DZUBER because he had last seen him in prison. PASCH stated that DZURER talked to him privately and asked him if he had been propositioned to kidnap GEHLEN and failing that, kill him. PASCH indicated that ie had whereupon DZUPER asked him how much money FELLERBERG had offered him to do the job. PASCH stated that when he told DZUMER that he was offered Five Hundred housand Marks, DZUBER told him that the job now was worth Five Million_Marks and as an easy way to be set for life. PASCH would be paid in American money and could ive anywhere in the world. PASCH stated that DEUBER told him that the jcb would be asy because although dEMLEN is under heavy guard "they" that he is in the abit of visiting a woman and at such times he is not under guard. PASCH advised hat he told DZUBER that he was not interested; that he may be a crook but he Idn't get mixed up in this type thing. FASCH advised that he asked DZLEER why he inted him to do the job and DZUBER told him (FASCR) because he spoke Lood English, is oducated in the United States and could get closer to GELLAN than anyone cloc.

PACCH advised that both DZUBER and FELLENHERG teld him that FICHARD ABES wanted to get GELET and indicated to him (PASCH) that PELLENHER and DLUBER ro receiving their orders from ILLARD CHARRS, however lave no details. PASCH stated that FELLENBERG made rumerous trips to Hamburg, Cermany 7d that when he had last seen him, it was approximately three (3) years age, in a bar in Hamburg.

PASCH advised that he got a job at the Shipping Agent's office in Hamburg, Germany on 27 February 1956 to work as a pumpman on the ship Febcal of Liberian Registry which was due into Bermuda on or about 2 March 1956. PASCH stated that he was furnished an airline ticket to Bermuda by the Shipping Agent in Hemburg and left Hamburg via Pan American Airlines on 29 February 1956 and arrived in New York at 1200 hours 1 March 1956. PASCH advised that he remained overnight it the Prince George Hotel on East 28th Street and left for berruda via Golonial Airlines, Friday, 2 March 1956, where he arrived at 1650 hours.

PASCH advised that he was in St. George, Hermuda, the night of 2 March 1955 and the above information was preying on his mind so he went to the St. George Folice Station to see an American Intelligence Officer, however would not cooperate with him and some Air Policeman took him over to the base where he talked to a Captain (Captain JOHNSCH). FASCH advised that he didn't tell anyone about this in Germany because he did not trust anyone.

P:ysical description of PASCH based on the undersigned's observations and information contained in PASCH'S passport is as follows:

> Name: AUGUST WILHELM PASCH, alias FRED BAILEY Date of Birth: 14 April 1913 Place of Birth: Erefeld, Eheinland, Germany Eace: Caucasian Height: 5'9" Weight: 152 Build: Heavy Hair: Red with streaks of gray; widow's peak, combed straight back Complexion: Ruddy (rod faced) Eyes: Light blue; was not wearing glasses. Occupation: Pumpman, Merchan: Marine (oil tanker) Speech: Speaks Lightly broken English, German Scars and Marks: Faded tattoo as follows:

On top of left hand has crossed flags, British flag on left, American flag on right, American spread eagle on right. Molow flags on left wrist in English the sentence "My life for my country".

4. At the time the undersigned talked to FASCH he was not evasive and appeared to be truthful. PASCH advised that his employers know nothing of his past and requested that if they are contacted, that no monition of his past be made income to them nor the reason for their being contacted be made known to them. : ASCH advised that he signed a one (1) year contract to work on the ship Febcal and he has been told that the ship's next port of call will be the West Indies. The undersigned advised PASCH that he may be contacted at a future date and he said that that would be perfectly all right.

5. On 5 March 1956, EFNEST COOPER, Customs Officer, St. George, Bermuda, advised this office that PASCH arrived in Bermuda on Flight 100, Colonial Airlines from New York, passenger list No. 14 on 2 March 1956.

COOPER also advised that the Febcal arrived at the oil dock, St. George on 2 Harch 1956, discharged it's cargo to Esso Oil Company and left in ballast for Aruba, West Indies on 5 March 1956.
