SUMMARY</u></p> <p>1. In connection with a teachers' exchange agreement between MEMBRUSH and CKPOLAR, Subject was selected to teach CKPOLAR language in Identity 1 for the duration of one year. Accompanied by his wife and daughter, Subject arrived in Hamburg on 20 September 1972, and was billeted in Identity 2 apartment which is his current residence. Dissatisfied with the conditions in Identity 1, Subject soon made arrangements through CATROJANI ORSE to visit her visits at least once a week - to teach evening courses in Identity 3, and continued looking for other opportunities which may help to extend his stay in Hamburg. With the help of [], Subject managed to obtain a temporary teaching job in Identity 4 in February 1973, and his current efforts are to cancel his contract with Identity 1 and get a permanent job with Identity 4 for an additional year.</p> <p>2. [] met Subject first socially on 16 January 1973, and has met him regularly, at least twice a week, since February 1973 when she helped Subject to get the part-time job in Identity 4. establishing contact with a local publisher, small presents, etc.) have now helped to establish a relationship of "mutual trust and confidence" between them. [REDACTED] has already provided us with a considerable amount of assessment data and other information of operational interest, and is currently engaged in a step-by-step attempt to learn the degree of Subject's susceptibility which we could use for an eventual direct approach to him by a BKHERALD officer.

3. In order to obtain a parallel assessment on Subject, we assigned CASUSTAIN-15 the task of attending Subject's language lessons in Identity 3. Starting on 2 May 1973, she has attended three lessons (for advanced students) so far, and has furnished us with a four-page summary of her impressions on Subject's behaviour and attitude. Although she has no close relationship with Subject at the moment, we hope that this will materialize in the near future because both she and Subject possess common interest in modern art and literature.

4. Although Subject is a target of opportunity, the fact remains that he is the only CKPOLAR national in our area who is in touch with two of our access agents, and who could be contacted and assessed by a BKHERALD officer much easier than the other target-individuals. As he does not require much of our time or money at the present time, we would like to follow through and request that he be assigned a 201-number and cryptonym.

II. OPERATIONAL

1. Background.

In addition to information contained in Reference A, we have learned that Subject's home address is Identity 5 and that he has a son, 13 years of age, who remained at home and is being cared for by Subject's grandmother. So far, Subject has revealed details only about his educational career, and nothing is known about his parents, his possible military service, or other activities of interest. According to what Subject has volunteered to [REDACTED], he studied German in what he called the "Pol. school" in [REDACTED] capital and work [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] note: Subject's [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] his wife, whom he married in 1960, has a teacher's diploma in English, and would like to take a part-time job in Hamburg.

2. Activities in Hamburg.

Although Identity 1 personnel treated Subject and his family with utmost courtesy - he was given a furnished apartment, and several teachers turned their classes over to him - he soon voiced loud dissatisfaction, claiming that the school was "below his niveau", and that he had expected to teach at university level. In order not to "irritate" Subject and the local CATROJANHORSE - where he became a steady visitor shortly after his arrival - Identity 6, who had been fundamental in bringing Subject to Hamburg, granted permission for Subject to take a part-time job in Identity 3, and later in Identity 4. As already stated in paragraph I.1. above, Subject is aiming now even higher, and is pulling strings in CATROJANHORSE and CATOPHAT in order to achieve a transfer to Identity 4 as a full-time teacher. His steady CATROJANHORSE contact and supporter in this respect is Identity 7, and his backer in CATOPHAT is Identity 8. Whatever little time Subject has left over from his teaching activities is spent either in CATROJANHORSE, where he apparently has to report on all his contacts and

activities, or in Identity 4 library with research work. Subject, whose wife and daughter returned home for the period 18 January - 26 May 1973 for "family reasons", made no apparent effort to enjoy this freedom as far as personal pleasures are concerned, and even did not permit female Identity 1 colleagues to enter his apartment.

3. Character and Behaviour.

According to [REDACTED], who knows Subject best, Subject belongs to the "new generation" of CKPOLARs who are relatively well educated, who dress in Western fashion, and who have learned Western manners (including table manners), i.e. it seems that he has received considerable training. The specific features of his character and behaviour which have come to our attention so far as the following:

a. He has never made an attempt to discuss politics, and quickly changed the topic when political themes were brought up by others.

b. He is a name-dropper - trying to make himself important and interesting - and a person who enjoys talking, and who demands attention from his audience.

c. He gets quickly mad when faced with arguments which oppose his viewpoints, but his oral reaction is seldom rude. When angered, he turns pale in his face and lapses into a silence.

d. He is fond of vodka and wine, and can carry his liquor well.

e. He is interested in modern art, literature, and theater.

f. He has indicated that he values money, constantly repeating that his current salary is too low in order to live comfortably and purchase presents for his relatives and friends, and that he would be willing to work harder (by giving private lessons) in order to raise his income.

g. He is extremely correct and polite when dealing with opposite sex, and has left the impression of a faithful husband and loving father.

i. He has shown visible interest in prohibited literature (when visiting [REDACTED]'s private office), claiming that "we do not have anything like this at home...".

4. Special Interests.

One of Subject's main interests is to have his manuscript (a comparative study of German and CKPOLAR languages) published in Hamburg, and thus gain some weight and prestige locally and at home. It was [REDACTED] who helped him to find an interested publisher (Identity 9) and who was thus able to strengthen her "friendship" with him. (Note: Identity 9 has the rights for all publications originating in Identity 4, meaning that we could not introduce a publisher controlled by BKHERALD.) Subject's other interests, already mentioned, are to get a permanent job with Identity 1, to earn more money and prestige, and to try to remain in Hamburg for an additional year. It is apparently also CATROJANHORSE interest to keep him

here for as long as possible.

5. Subject's Contacts.

Based on information obtained from [REDACTED] [REDACTED], CASUSTAIN-15, and CALLIKAK, we have been able to identify a total of 23 individuals - six of them CKPOLAR nationals - who maintain contact with Subject. The majority of them are connected with Identities 1, 3, and 4, and are going to remain in steady contact with Subject throughout his stay in Hamburg. We are currently in the process of checking them out locally, and will trace them with Headquarters at a later date. Both [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and CASUSTAIN-15 have been assigned the task of identifying Subject's additional new contacts.

6. Possible Intelligence Affiliation.

Subject's steady contact with Identity 7 - whom CAWHISPER has classified as "Known PDQUICK" - leaves us with the speculation that Subject may have been co-opted prior to his arrival in Hamburg. At the moment, there is no evidence of his direct involvement in intelligence activities, but he has definitely shown pointed interest in at least one individual (a "Juso" who serves as [REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s assistant in Identity 4, and who is scheduled to attend a language seminar in CKPOLAR capital this summer), and he has been equally interested in overt scientific information published by the "Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft" which is available in Identity 4, and which has been "fed" to him by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] with the idea of testing his intelligence interests. What could be considered as a possible attempt by Subject to frame the "Juso" for a PDQUICK approach, was his offer to furnish the "Juso" with CKPOLAR currency prior to his scheduled departure from Hamburg, and his statement that the latter should not be afraid to smuggle currency into CKPOLAR "because nobody is being searched at the border". The "Juso" (Identity 10), on whom we are going to report separately at a later date, was clever enough to turn down Subject's offer.

7. Operational Developments.

As far as contact with Subject, CASUSTAIN-4 is [REDACTED] [REDACTED] favors), and are hearing [REDACTED] [REDACTED] (contact with Subject's wife) as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] already has an invitation for a "family party" in Subject's apartment. This relationship should provide us with the still missing biographic data, help us to gain more assessment information, and furnish us with ideas as to what approach we should use to Subject. The current teacher-student relationship between Subject and CASUSTAIN-15 is still new, but we hope that it will develop into a personal contact in the near future.

III. Comments

1. We hope to be able to complete a good portion of phase two of our preliminary plan prior to 10 July 1973 when Subject is returning home for the summer, and follow through upon his return to Hamburg in late August 1973. As already stated, Subject will continue pulling strings toward his transfer to Identity 4, and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] will do the same through her channels. Should Subject's transfer materialize, his contact with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] would become even closer than it is now and it would work for our advantage.

2. We will continue reporting on this case, and would like to place Subject in direct contact with a BKHERALD officer - preferably with one who is not attached to Hamburg Base, and who could use "hit and run tactics" - after we have completed our assessment of Subject and discovered the best avenue of approach to him. Our current estimate is - based on Subject's apparent desire for money and material values - that the approach and the Case Officer's cover should be tailored along commercial lines.
