1. On lat and 2nd September 1949, General Cottlob BERGER was reinterregated at the Prison in LANDEBERO/Lech(4809-1055E) in compliance with Specific Request #685,

- In reference to paragraph #3, Specific Request #685, the following details were obtained from BERGER;

Owneral REGIE definitely verified a previous statement that he has several thousand of his former efficers and men, who are loyal to him and who are now situated in the Eusaian Zone and in positions to funnel back all kinds of information. In regard to this question, REGIE effect the following outlined suggestions for the establishment of an intelligence organization: (His views on the subject are literally translated from REGIE's notes, attached to this report as inclosure (1).
- b. In his opinion, the basic question for any intelligence work is the problem to have either pedd professional agents or patriots. He stated the Russians employ mostly patriots, the are superior to the pedd agents. Patriots render their services without pay, only actual expanses are compensated which must be kept on a moderate scale, with the exception of individual cases.
- 6. However the patriot must have a goal, even if it is still hanging in the stars. At the time when I prevented Adolf mitter's haylos hands on the two highest American officers in Jerman captivity, I did this not with an eye on recompense, but because I could reconcile no other behavior with the principles of honor I had held down to my SS men. However, I had the simultaneous idea that the two gentlemen could draw the attention of the President of the United States to the enormous danger threatening from the East. My plan was wrecked by the intervention of himmler (Agents remark: Himmler held the two officers three weeks in Constance).

Then Pr. Spirey came to see me at Landsborg, I realized that the principles of honor still held good in America and within its Army. I did not want Colonel Spivey to have any difficulties on secount of his attitude and therefore, as a warning and for verification, give him important information which had reached me even through prison walls. This information came to me through men and women whom I knew as unobjectionable and absolutely devoted to the truth.

In doing this I had no intention whatever to give myself undus importance or to obtain release from Landsberg by devious weys. I cm held here unjustly and I know that the day of my rolease will come. On the other hand, I was influenced by my concern about Germany as well as the entire Vestern World. I neither underestimate, nor exaggerate the danger from the East.

For inner-political reasons Russie is a gient on feet of clay, but these feet are quite solid. Through the German invasion Russia was emabled to identify the greater part of the anti-communist forces, and to destroy them. To this must be added the greatest political imprudence of the Western Fovers: the extradition of about 150 000 men who fought in separate all-Russian divisions of the Western-Sitho extradition of viasov and the Kossack Corps. What remains of it now should be shifted but everything can be done if the will of the American Army to hold the West is stronger than Stelin's will to deminate the World. In Russia itself American must begin to regain the confidence which was lost through the extradition.
