I. PRISONER: DESCRIPTION AND VITAL STATISTICS

Dr. Hellmuth VON CRAWON was born 6 October 1892 at Quaritz/Schlesien. A German National, his present home address is Steinbach am Attersee, Upper Austria. Subject was an export merchant in civilian life, a Rittmeister in the Wehrmacht assigned to the "Amt Auslandnachrichten und Abwehr (Amtsgruppe Ausland)" and the "Wehrwirtschaftsstab", both agencies of the OKW.

II. BRIEF PARTY OR SERVICE HISTORY

Subject was a Party member from 1931 on. His approximate Party number is 690,000. He claims never to have held a Party rank.

I. SOURCE

A. Reference

For description and vital statistics of Dr. Hellmuth von CRAMON see Preliminary Information Report, Ref. No. SC78/USDIC/PE14.

B. Activities

In connection with the following report, it should be mentioned that Subject was not often in possession of complete information on the functions and organization of the departments, since he was directly assigned to the Wehrwirtschaftsstab. He was sent to the Auslandsabteilung des Amtes Auslandsnachrichten und Abwehr merely as liaison officer. It should also be noted that Subject is a merchant by profession and that his opinions and ideas were influenced by an economic, rather than by a military outlook.

II. CAREER

Subject was a career officer in World War I and rose from his initial rank of lieutenant to captain during the war. After his discharge he became an export merchant and opened his own business in Berlin in 1922. He exported mainly aeronautical equipment to all parts of the world until 1931, when the depression forced him into bankruptcy. Being a personal friend of King Carol II of Rumania and a shrewd businessman, Source used his connection to become, once again, economically independent. In 1937 he established the "Sued Ost Handelsgesellschaft von Ramin & Co.", which is still in existence.

On 31 August 1939, Source was ordered to report to the Wehrwirtschaftsstab of the OKW for service, keeping his World War I rank of Rittmeister. The Wehrwirtschaftsstab sent him to the Auslandsabteilung des Amtes fuer Auslandsnachrichten und Abwehr as liaison officer. Early in 1940, because of difficulty with the foreign office and his commanding officer, Source applied for discharge in order to return to his export business. Because of this application and the friction with his superiors, he was discharged on 20 April 1940. After returning to his business, he made trips to Hungary, Rumania and Spain. Through his connection with notables of various countries he was able to obtain passports and travel permits without difficulty. From the date of his

discharge he never again entered any branch of military service.

III. THE AUSLANDSABTEILUNG DES AMTES FUER AUSLANDSNACHRICHTEN UND ABWEHR

A. Function

The main tasks of the Auslandsabteilung des Amtes fuer Auslandsnachrichten und Abwehr were to collect, evaluate, and use political and military information of the whole world. The results, in brief and concise form, were sent to Admiral CANARIS, chief of the Abwehr, who, in turn, forwarded them to Feldmarschall KEITEL, commander in chief of the OKW.

c The information material consisted in total of press releases and radio reports from Germany's allies, the neutral countries, and enemy countries. The most valuable material, was derived from intercepted telegrams from enemy or neutral sources. The telegrams were deciphered in a special department of the Auslandsabteilung, which was "Off Limits" to all unauthorized personnel. The deciphered telegrams and radiograms were classified "Top Secret" and went directly to the chief of the Auslandsabteilung. In addition, the department also received numerous reports of a political and military nature from reliable informants in foreign countries. As far as Source knows, the department did not have its own agents in foreign countries.

B. Organization

The Auslandsabteilung, headed by Kapitaen zur See (later Admiral) BUERKNER, consisted of five groups:

- Group I : Political section
- Group II : Administrative section
- Group III : Ground warfare section
- Group IV : Sea warfare section
- Group V : International laws section

Each of these groups was headed by a section chief and his staff. These section chiefs had a daily briefing with the Abteilungschef. The political section gave a briefing on the political situation to all officers of the Abteilung from time to time.

The Auslandsabteilung, although under the same departmental chief as the three Abwehr Abteilungen, was totally different in its organization and functions.

C. Operational Value

Having been in contact either directly or indirectly with most of the officers of the Auslandsabteilung, Source believes that the department was grossly ineffective. The officers, often reserve officers who had returned to the army because they had been unsuccessful in civilian life, were for the most part too old and inexperienced in their particular jobs. Cooperation between the foreign office and the department was extremely poor. The reports from foreign countries, often not the actual facts, but rather the opinions of certain informants or V-Leute, arrived at irregular intervals and usually very late. Nevertheless, it was necessary that the OKW receive direct information on foreign politics, without being dependent upon the foreign office. (It must be mentioned that above statements do not necessarily represent true facts, but rather the opinion of Source. See also SHAEF Handbook on the GIS, E.D.S./G.9)

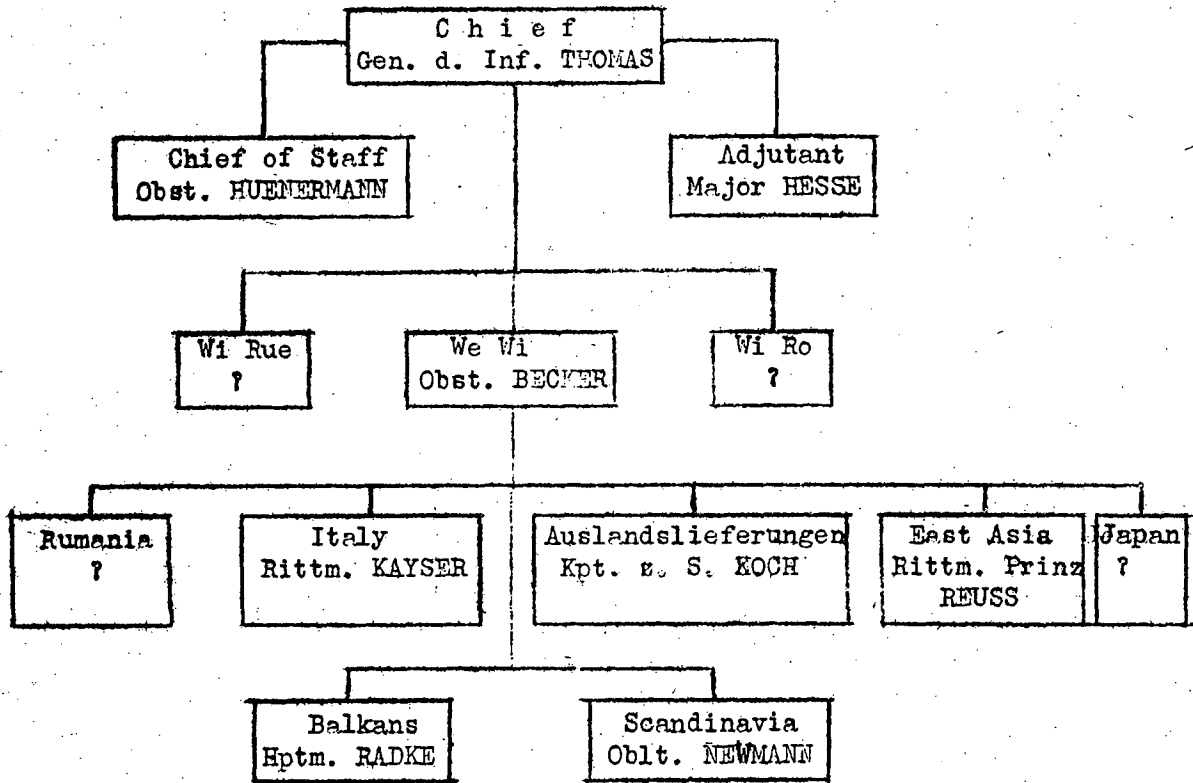

V. SONDERSTAB H.W.K. (SONDERSTAB FUER HANDELSKRIEG UND WIRTSCHAFTLICHE KAMPFMASSNAHMEN)

A. Description

The Sonderstab H.W.K. was a special department organized to procure all materials essential to both the Axis and the Allied powers, by breaking the blockade and buying these materials from foreign markets. In order to keep essential materials from the Allies, Germany would often buy such materials without intending to use or even to transport them to Germany. The department was headed by Admiral GROSS, who was directly responsible only to the the OKW.

In order to be able to buy materials on foreign markets, the department had to procure foreign currencies. Therefore, representatives were sent out to make connections with bankers and big businessmen in foreign countries. In charge of the procurement of foreign currencies was Oberstleutnant KAYSER, who, in the course of his activities, became connected with a number of disreputable characters. His methods were so effective, however, that he was able to carry out all orders from above. In 1943 he was suddenly arrested for reasons unknown to Source, tried by a court martial, degraded, and sentenced to jail.

KAYSER had in his employ a merchant by the name of von HINTZENSTERN, who resided in Italy. This man was arrested and sentenced to jail in Spain in 1943 because of illegal transactions in foreign currencies.

The department also had a representative in Paris, an Oberstleutnant Geheimrat BODENSTEIN, who lived in the Hotel Claridge; but, as far as Source knows, he was never actively connected with any transaction or mission.

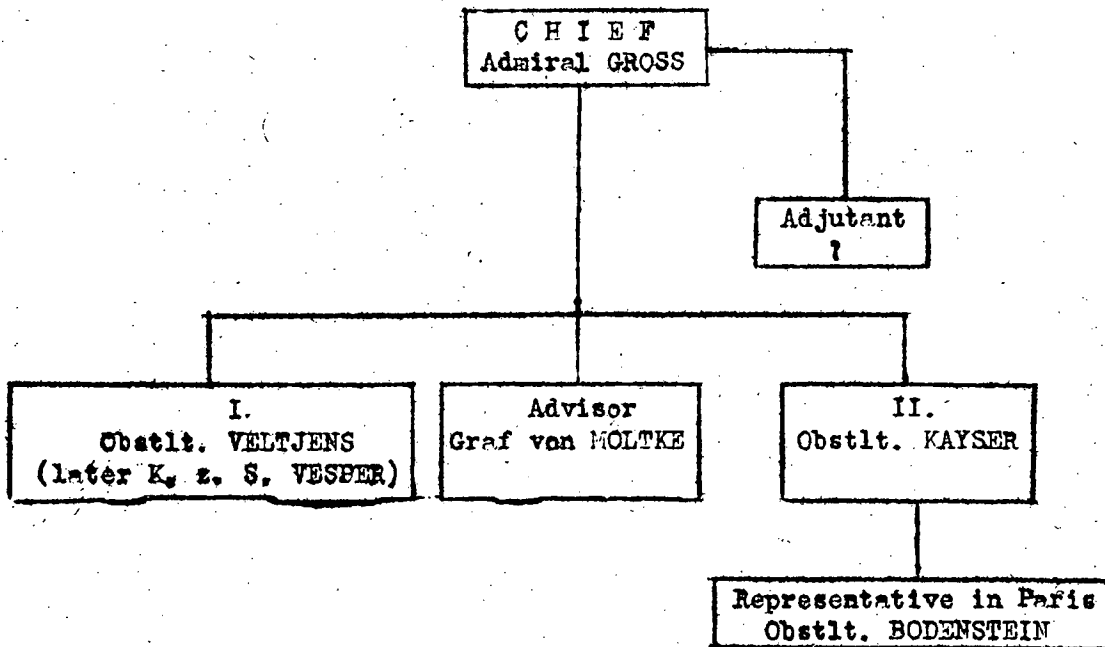
Source was never directly connected with the Sonderstab HWK, but through Obstlt. KAYSER, whom he had known in the Wehrwirtschaftsstab and whom he visited frequently until his arrest in 1943, he learned much about the department.

The Sonderstab HWK, though a small organization, was extremely effective and was credited with keeping German economically "stable" until 1943.

AGGE AF BOO, von

Oberstleutnant; Referent in the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten und Abwehr in the OKW. Born about 1885, probably in one of the Baltic states. Approximately six feet one inch tall, slim built, dark hair. Last seen in April 1940 in Berlin.

BECKER

"Gen. Major der Luftwaffe." Section chief in the Wehrwirtschaftsstab of the OKW. Born about 1897; German. Approximately five feet eight inches tall, dark-blond hair. Last seen in April 1940 in Berlin.

BECKER

Obstlt. Inf. Referent in the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten und Abwehr. Born about 1899. German. Approximately five feet nine inches tall, blond hair. Regular army officer. Last seen in February 1940 in Berlin.

BODENSTEIN, (Geheimrat)

Obstlt.d.Res. Representative of the Sonderstab HWK (Handelskrieg und wirtschaftliche Kempfmassnahmen) in Paris. German. Born about 1877. Approximately five feet ten inches tall, sparse hair, stout, scar on cheek. Friend of the Duke of Monaco. Last seen in April 1944 in Paris.

BRINKMANN

Oberst z. V. Gruppenleiter (Ground Warfare Section) in the Auslandsabteilung in the Department of Auslandsnachrichten und Abwehr of the OKW. German. Born about 1877. Approximately five feet ten inches tall, grayish hair; heavy build. Last seen in Summer 1942 in Berlin.

BUERKNER

Admiral. Abteilungschef in the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten und Abwehr of the OKW. German. About 53 years of age, approximately five feet eleven inches tall, dark hair. Regular army officer. Last seen in Summer 1943 in Berlin.

ESEBECK, von

Oberst, Cav. Referent in the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr of the OKW. German. Born about 1887. Approximately six feet tall, slim, gray hair. Later military attache in Lisbon. Last seen in February 1940 in Berlin.

GEISE

Obstlt. der Luftwaffe. Gruppenleiter (Political Section) in the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr of the OKW. Born about 1904, approximately five feet ten inches tall, slim, dark hair. Missing in action over England since 1940. Last seen in January 1940 in Berlin.

GEIDERN, Freiherr von

Oberst, Cav. Assistant chief of the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr in the OKW. German. About 58 years of age, approximately five feet eight inches tall, dark blond hair. Last seen in April 1940 in Berlin.

GERSTENBERG

Generalleutnant and Air Attache at the German Legation in Bucharest. Born about 1893. Approximately five feet nine inches tall. Stout, sparse red-blond hair. Last seen in 1943 in Bucharest.

GIEBELSTADT, Freiherr,
Zobel von

Major, Cav. z. V. Auxiliary Officer in the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr in the OKW. German. Born about 1889, approximately five feet nine inches tall, dark hair. Insurance agent in civilian life. Last seen in Spring 1945 in Berlin.

GROOS, Dr.

Admiral. Antschef in the Sonderstab HWK (Handelskrieg und wirtschaftliche Kampf-massnahmen) of the OKW. Last seen in 1943 in Berlin.

HEINBURG, von

Major. Referent in the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr of the OKW. German. Born about 1888. Approximately five feet nine inches tall, sparse, dark hair. Last seen in February 1940 in Berlin.

Major. Adjutant of the Amtsleiter in the Wehrwirtschaftsstab of the OKW. German. Born about 1899, approximately five feet nine inches tall, blond hair. Last seen in April 1940 in Berlin.

HEYDEN-RYNSCH, von

Legationsrat in the Auswaertiges Amt, attached to the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr of the OKW. German. Born about 1894. Approximately five feet eleven inches tall, dark hair. Later Botschaftsrat at the German Embassy in Madrid. Last seen in March 1944 in Madrid.

HINTZENSTERN, von

Representative of the Sonderstab HWK (Handelskrieg und wirtschaftliche Kampfmassnahmen) in Spain. Merchant, received jail sentence in Spain. Born about 1896. German. Approximately five feet eight inches tall, round face. Last seen in 1942 (?) in Berlin.

HOHENZOLLERN, Fuerst von

Head of the Royal Rumanian family. Living at Sigmaringen, Wuerttemberg. Born 1891 at Sigmaringen. Approximately five feet six inches tall. Robust build. Gray hair. Last seen in 1943 in Sigmaringen.

HUENERMANN

General-Major. Chief of Staff in the Wehrwirtschaftsstab of the OKW. German. Born

KAYSER

Oberstleutnant. Referent in the Wehrwirtschaftsstab in the OKW, later Gruppenleiter in the Sonderstab HWK. Afterwards sentenced to jail and degraded. German. Born about 1892, approximately five feet ten inches tall, dark blond hair. Last seen in 1943 in Berlin.

KENSCHITZKY, von

Oberst in the Luftwaffe. Referent in the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr of the OKW. G German. Born about 1894, approximately five feet ten inches tall, slim, blond hair. Was later in Rumania. Last seen in 1942 in Berlin.

KIEP

Oberleutnant d. Res. Referent in the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr of the OKW. German. Born about 1888, approximately five feet eleven inches tall, slim build, sparse blond hair. Last seen by Source in April 1940 in Berlin. Hanged in 1944.

KNAPP

Hauptmann in the General Staff of the Luftwaffe. Later Major. Generalstabsoffizier in the Wehrwirtschaftsstab (?) of the OKW. Born about 1907, approximately five feet eleven inches tall, dark hair. German. Last seen in April 1940 in Berlin.

KOCH

Kapitän zur See. Gruppenleiter in the Wehrwirtschaftsstab of the OKW. Later Wehrwirtschaftsoffizier in Finland. German. Born about 1889, approximately five feet nine inches tall, sparse, dark blond hair. Last seen in April 1940 in Berlin.

LUDWIG

Major in the Luftwaffe. Gruppenleiter, (succeeding Geise in the Political Section) in the Auslandsabteilung of the Department

for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr of the OKW. Probably Austrian. Born about 1897, approximately five feet eight inches tall. Gray hair and moustache. Last seen in April 1940 in Berlin.

MOLTKE, Graefin

First secretary of the Abteilungschef of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr of the OKW. German, probably from Berlin. About 36 years of age, approximately five feet five inches tall, slim build, dark hair. Last seen in April 1940 in Berlin.

MOLTKE, Graf von

v Lawyer assigned to the Auslandsabteilung of the Department for Auslandsnachrichten and Abwehr of the OKW, and Sonderstab HWK of the OKW. German. Born about 1899, approximately six feet five inches tall, very slim, dark hair. Last seen in 1943 in Berlin.

NADOLNY

Leutnant d. Res. Previously assigned to the Wehrwirtschaftsstab of the OKW. German. Born about 1899, approximately five feet eleven inches tall, slim build, dark hair. Last seen in March 1945 in Traunstein, Bavaria.

NEUMANN

Oblt. d. Res. Referent in the Wehrwirtschaftsstab of the OKW. Born about 1904, approximately five feet nine inches tall, slim, dark-blond hair. Last seen in Spring 1940 in Berlin.

Unteroffizier. Kurier in the Sonderstab HWK (Handelskrieg und wirtschaftliche Kampf-massnahmen) in the OKW. German. Born in Berlin about 1909, approximately six feet three inches tall, very slim, blond hair. Last seen in 1943 in Berlin.
