2. OKUMIYA Masatake presented the following questions for discussion:

a. What measures are the Soviet and Chinese Communist taking or what measures will they take to neutralize Japan and bring her into the Communist camp?

Practically everyone agreed to the following conclusion: The Soviets and Chinese Communists will not pressure or intimidate Japan but will try to make Japan steer herself into the Communist camp. For this reason the Soviets and Chinese Communist will endeavor to aid the progressive elements to gain control of the Parliament and if possible the Cabinet.

b. Is the Chinese Communist's desire to achieve economic cooperation with Japan based on their desire to free themselves from their total dependence on the USSR?

It was generally agreed that for the time being the Chinese

Communists will not think of breaking away from the Soviets economically.

c. What is the future of the United Nations?

It was concluded that while the United Nations Organization may undergo a number of changes, organizationally and otherwise, it is very unlikely that it will be dissolved or made useless.

d. How will Communism change in the future?

Everybody was of the view that as the world civilization progresses Communism will "round off its own rugged edges" and become very close to advanced capitalism. However, it is believed that no matter how it changes internally, the USSR will never "take down its plaque" of Communism.

e. Following the above discussion, OKUMIYA explained the present situation on guided missiles.
