Dear Sir:

Reference is made to memorandum for you by Mr. James Angleton on April 27, 1967, CSCI-316/01650-67, copy of which was furnished to this Service concerning Erik Heine, born September 11, 1919 in Estonia.

The memorandum included reference to the litigation, with Mr. Heine as the plaintiff, which developed from statements made by Juri Raus. It also included a request that, owing to the pending lawsuit, no action be taken to bar the entry of Mr. Heine into this country without prior coordination with your agency. Certiorari was denied by the Supreme Court on April 19, 1971 in the case of Heine v. Raus. (39 LW 3406)

In view of the conclusion of the litigation in the case by the Supreme Court decision, we propose to include Mr. Heine in our lookout system at all ports of entry as he is considered, on the basis of the April 27, 1967 memorandum, to be inadmissible under the provisions of section 212(a)(28) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 USC 1182) and subject to the exclusion without hearing under section 235(c) of that Act (8 USC 1225(c)).

We will defer initiating the lookout for Mr. Heine until May 10, 1971 to afford you an opportunity to give us the benefit of your views concerning the case.
