Sources obtained the information contained in this report from conversations with General Hennei and members of the Hungarista group.

- 1. The Hungarista group is an extreme right-wing organization of Hungarian refugees led by former arrow-Cross General aroad Hennei. General Hennei claims to have been appointed by Scalasi as his successor, and all Hungarista members recognize him as the legitimate leader of the Hungarian state. FIGLO COMENT: The Hungarista group was a pre-war ultra-nationalistic organization founded by Hubay, and differed from the Nazis only in that it proclaimed the Eagyars as the "master race." After Szalasi's coup d'etat on 15 October 1944, the organization was merged with the Arrow Cross Party although still retaining its own organizational structure. Szalasi himself was the head of the Hungarista and Hennei was his deputy?
- 2. General Hermei stated that he keeps a roster of 200-300 young Hungarista who have voluntewred for armed partisan activity, and claims to be in contact with many adherents in the Department of Zala in southwestern Hungary. He is currently looking for Western, particularly American, support for his plans. Sources Characterized Hennei as a man of limited ability but unlimited ambition, and believe these claims to be greatly exaggerated.
  - 3. Hennei's chief lieutenants in the organization are:
    - a. Janos Lengyel, Salzburg, his deputy.
    - b. Leszlo Szerecz, Salzburg, in charge of partiean activities.
    - c. Ernos comboss, Innsbruck, in charge of evacuating Hungarista

- d. Janos Gnandt, Salzburg, Hungarista chief for Land Salzburg,
- e. Ede Tellos. Hungarista chief for Braunau (Upper Austria); regarded as a deviationist because he does not fully recognize Hennei's authority?
- f. Tyekenyesi fnu, Tallos' deputy; a grammar school teacher in a DP camp near Braunau.
- g. Zsarojan (fnu), Hungarista chief in Linz; living under an unknown alias in Camp wegscheid near Linz.

h. Farkas Sreter, Graz, Hungarista chief for the Graz area FIELD

- i. Ference Nemeth, Graz, Sreter's deputy; also a deviationist from Hennei's policies.
- j. Lajos Nagy, Hungarista chief for Voecklabruck (Upper Austria); a former gendarme now working in Wels.
- k. Tame Uhrin, Salzburg, truck driver between Linz and Salzburg for the Stars & Stripes distribution office; an enthusiastic Hennei supporter who may be used as a courier.
- 4. The Hungarista organization is supported by membership dues collected by the local leaders to finance General Hennei's expenses and the organization's newspaper. Ut es Col. General Hennei is on bad terms with General Zako and the MHEK because the latter refused to recognize with "rightful" position as Szalasi's heir. In view of Hennei's plan to evacuate Hungarista dependents to Spain in case of war, however, there may be some contact between the two organizations.
