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c. Information on weaknesses or unusual strains threatening the stability of constitutional government in West Germany. Dangers to democracy.

d. Covert plans and policies of the major political parties, including information on behind-the-scenes maneuvers of their leading personalities.

e. Activities of the extreme right and the extreme left.

f. Information bearing on the security and reliability of the Federal Republic from the V.S. point of view; under this category we seek knowledge on infiltration or subversion of the Federal Republic by hostile elements, on the corruption, opportunism or hostility toward the West and in particular the V.S. on the part of key personnel whether on the Federal or Land level; drifts toward the East; illegal or clandestine connections of prominent personalities, etc.

g. Organisation, personnel, plans, policies, capabilities and activities of the West German intelligence and security services.

h. Classified (covert) research and developmental activities in the scientific and technical field.

5. The above Kill's are not listed in any order of relative importance, nor should we concentrate on satisfying any one of them at the expense of the others. They are meant to serve as general guide lines for the direction of our clandestime collection effort in West Germany.

6. It is perhaps unnecessary to state that information obtained in the course of our activities should be reported regardless of their bearing on the above EEI's. There are many analysts in Washington and their appetite for information could never be satisfied. Therefore additional morsels will always be velocme. However, because of the limited resources available for KUDOVE collection we cannot organize the collection effort primarily on basis of what is veloced by the analysts since experiance shows that everything is appreciated, partly because few people here read the German press. In their "post mortems" KUJAZZ has stated repeatedly that information needs on Western Europe can be satisfied to a large extent through the efficient collation and analysis of the large masses of available overt information. We are inclined to agree with that, and

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draw the conclusion that KUDOVE collection in West Germany should concentrate on those matters which can only be obtained covertly or on which confirmation through covert means is essential to U.S. security interests.
