

He supports that perhaps General Glagerap and his pen are doing some kind of intelligence work for the U.S., but he is not certain.

3. I believe I told you I assertained from Dr. Hilger that the SAF are being used by Operation RUSTY for certain things. I an passing along this information to you in the event that you my decide to bring this matter to the attention of Admiral Billenkoetter or those who are responsible for the administration of Operation RUSTY.

Declassified and Approved for Release by the Central Intelligence Agency Date: General Piotr Glazenap, about seventy, was an officer in the pre-revolutionary Russian Army, then a general in the White Armies in the Civil War. He later acquired German citizensaip and had the rank of a General of the Reignswehr. In Russian political circles Glazenap has always belonged to the extreme rightist groups, although he never occupied the position of a lender.

Jurin, the last war Glazenap lived in German-occupied Foland and was absorbed in Duriness of his own. The kind of Duriness conducted by Glazenap before and durif the war is constines criticized in Russian circles; it was reported as not cuite unimpermade. However, the most important reproduce mede by Audaiane is the Fast that he did not even try to help Russian & prisoners of war and the so-called Ostaroedters.

Early in 1948 Giezenap put nimbers at the head of a new organization called SAP (Soyuz Andreyevekovo Plega). (At embraces rommer Russian officers (borth of the White Arries and of the Viesov Army). At first an unpolitical organization the SAP under the Giezenap moved fast toward the Konarchist Right and actually became an important ally of the Supreme Konarchist Council.

At the same time it became known in Munich that a building has been bought and reconstructed by the SAF for its own purposes; that a network of local units is being organized by it all over Messern Germany; and that a number of agents with the necessary funds travel from one local unit to the other to establish contact and to strenghten the organization. The general opinion spong Hussians is that American all ond funds are behind this artificial growth of Diszenap's movement. There is a great deal of disappointment among Russians that "democratic Americans" have ender a man like Giszenap to head a Russian organization.

Rani; in October I went to see General Clay; I asked him, among other things, about these Glazenap rumors. General Clay emphatical ly denied that any support is given by American Authorities to the Runsian general or to his group; he also denied that Glazenap's end his men's names are on the American payroll.

However, in November 1948, the Hussian newspaper <u>Ne Perelome</u> printed the text of a document by which a certain property left over from the Givil War times was thered over now, with American consent, to General Glazenap "for custody" Moreover, it is repored that Glazenap, though not direc 1 on an American payroll, is being supported by a German section (consisting mainly of Germane) of the American Army Intelligence.
