- 1. One of the members of the security branch of Sipper's bendquarters of section reported to us that a Mr. Strong, SID, Borlin, approached Subject on Specifier and solicited close cooperation in the SED work field, specifically that he leave TPENSER and go to work for Mr. Strong. The latter, reportedly, questioned Subject in detail concerning the identity of the outfit to which he had previously delivered reports. Mr. Strong reportedly reminded Subject, as an added indusement, of the outstanding possibility of prosecution by a US court on charges adding from a pistol-drawing incident in Sovember '52. Lipper saked us to intervene and sak Mr. Strong to drop contact with Subject. We are advising the requestor that his chief has already agreed that Sipper would keep hands off. However, we are passing on the report for your information, as a matter of possible security interest.
- 2. We shall keep you advised of any further information passed to us by Lipper concerning Subject. However, we believe that it is desirable to bear in mind the fact that Subject might, at any time, maintain or resume contact with Lipper. Occasional Carriage testing might be advisable if his work for you is of a sensitive nature. Per ARMA-7478 Subject's main value is his affiliation with TPERBER and access to their leads. This is probably obvious to Lipper, too; indeed, Subject's continued affiliation with TPERBER was the basis for Lipper's decision to abandon contact.
