Elfrico PAPPROTTA Care

- 1. We all agree that the ZIPPER act of recruiting agents in the OCIS was not a friendly act. Hore reprehensible still was the fact that they did not immediately extrect the PAPPHOTTA item from the Frau MORRER report and hand carry it to us with a large "Sehr Drigend" on it. Instead, they left it up to us to pick it up when we poured through the voluminous ZIFFER interrogation of From PARTIER. All of this has been taken up personally with UTILITY in the most critical terms. Against this background we set about to take some action in cooperation with BOB, obviously an interested party in view of the sensitivity of the GCIS, to correct the situation. discussed the case first with in Berlin 29 January.
- 2. As I understand it, in agreement on future action was reached between of PCB and of BCB and of BCB at a meeting in Berlin of 303 at a meeting in Berlin reported that C had already independently collected sufficient derogatory information on both PAPPROTTA and HEINE to justify discharging the former and transferring the latter. It was agreed that C should be uncouraged to take this action on the basis of his own information.
- 3. CIPPER has now come to us with the report received from their agent HEDDER that on 10 March ____ asked HEDDER to make From HURING available to CAINSON 30 for questioning. ____ yeard that he had been informed by his "American contact" that ZIPFER had custody of Free HOERER and that in an interrogation obtained from Frau HOEMER by ZIPPER, Frau HOEMER had distinctly stated that Wolfgang HOERER labelled PAPPROTTA a Soviet apy. For this reason 7 desired HEITHER, as a MIPPER member, to cooperate in the matter by revealing From HOEHER's whereabouts.
- li. In retrospect I think that probably the PAPPECTIA case has been handled wrong from the first. Perhaps it would have been better if we had made a completely official and overt matter of the whole thing, advising ZTPPER that this was necousary. The fact remains, however, that this was not the decision and that we did not inform ZTPPER that we were going to either make the entire affair a matter of official record with Public Safety in Berlin or pass it directly to the German Colice in the CCIS. In any case, we would not have agreed to the information being passed via BOB's agent back to ZIPFNR's agent. ... thus completing the circle.

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- 5. Because ZIPPER was in such a completely indefensible position originally, we do not feel particularly embarramed vis-e-vis ZIPPER regarding this case. However, we might as well face up to the fact that the chances of continued access to ZIPPER case dessions, original interregations and internal ZIPPER operational correspondence, provided routinely at the working PCE/ZIPPER staff level, is inevitably reduced by incidents of this sort. We believe it equally in BOB and POB interest that we continue to have access to such material.
- 6. We did pass off this incident as an indiscretion on the part of Public Safety, deplicing the fact that the <u>HURRER</u> case was mentioned to HEIRDER who is closely connected to PAPIROTTA who may be a Soviet agent. 2IPPER grapathised and expressed understanding that we had found it prosessary to pass the information to Public Safety.
- 7. Can you let us know what action ______ plans to take. Also, we would like to receive the ______ material on PAPPROTTA and HELHOUS (part of which inspected 9 March) which I requested initially on the 29th of Jamesy.
