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GENT REPORT

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21 December 1955 :

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ECEPER, Rolfgang (S)

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On 15 December 1955, Source TAN revealed the following information:

- a. Source departed STUTTSART (NV 1305), Germany, by intersonal train on the sorning of 10 December 1955 and arrived in LEIPZIG (US 1891). East Germany, at approximately 1900 hours, 10 December 1955. He was set at the LEIPZIG railroad station by SUBJECT, and a car and chauffeur were waiting for them near the station. The car was a late model IFA, license number unknown. The chauffeur's name was not mentioned by SUBJECT, and Source was not able to learn the name. The chauffeur was approximately 22 to 27 years of age, had dark hair, and was apparently of German origin. SUBJECT and Source were driven to DRESDEN (V3 1257), East Germany, in the IFA automobile.
- b. Execute to DRESDEN, SUBJECT related that on 6 December 1955, he had received a telephone call from Field Marshal von PAULUS, residing in DRESDEM, to the effect that von PAULUS wanted Source and HOEHER to come to DRESDEM for a business discussion. Subsequent to the call from von PAULUS, SUBJECT sent a registered letter to Source requesting that Source come to LEIPZIG on 10 December 1955. SUBJECT enclosed an Aufentaltsgenehigung (Visitoris Permit) in the letter, which authorized Source to visit LEIPZIG. This would enable Source to make the trip sithout writing to SUBJECT for the permit. SUBJECT and Source discussed general political issues. The main topic was the reunification difficulty facing East and West Germany. No mention was made of SUBJECT's position with the National Zeitung (National Newspaper) nor his affiliation with the SfS (Staatssekretarist fuer Staatssicherheit State Secretariat for State Security). SUBJECT noither requested information from Source, nor did he request that Source perform any tanks when he returned to West Germany.
- c. Upon arrival in DRESDEE, at approximately 2100 hours, they proceeded to the Weisser Birsch section of DAESDEN. They entered a villa, address unknown, and were met by von PAULUS and a Fau BEITEL who acted se walet and Adjutant to won PAULUS. The chauffour remained outside with the automobile. von PAULUS had met Source during the Summer of 1955 at a neeting of the ACS (Arbeitagemeinschaft Deutscher Soldaten - Horkers Society of German Soldiers) An East BEHLIN (UU 9220), Jernany. Von PAULUSY SUBJECT, SETTEL and Source ingaged in conversation. you PAULUS related to them that he had manted Source o come to DRESDEY because he, von PAULUS, had had another stroke and wouldhave to return to a rest home in NELZEN (nos), East Gormany, for treatment in a few days. Momenter he wished to speak personally with Source before entering the rest home. von PADLUS opined that Source would be a good person to act as an intermediary between von PAULUS and General Jottlob BERGER to arrange a BENGIR to go shead with plane to entablish a Baden/Auerttenburg group of the Abs and to attempt to mend the split within the Rast-West factions of the ADS. The Corner had been planned at the AUS westing in BEHLIN which BERUER had not attended (continued)

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won PAULUS believed that the ADS meeting had been well handled but there was now a possibility of a split in the organization.

- d. von PAULUS also related the following: The outlook for the reunification of Germany had become worse. Herr Konrad ADENAUER, at the conference in MOSCOV (nca), Russia, had, by an unwise agreement to exchange Ambassadors with MOSCOP, sanctioned the division of Germany. This policy had resulted in strengthening the SED (Sozialistische Einheitspartei Deutschlands -Socialist Unity Party of Germany) which in strengthening itself, was attempting to use only members of the SED in the East German government. Because of ADEXAGER actions in MCSCC+, the only way to remedy the situation and to assist in reunification would be to establish direct contact with Russia in order to work out a bargain. The continuous disagreements among the Big Four makes the situation even worse. It is the desire of all Germans to prevent the Fatherland from becoming a battlefield for the idealogies of a foreign country; therefore, one must employ all of one's resources in working for reunification, and, for this aim, contact with the Russians will speed reunification.
- e. von PAULUS them requested that Source arrange for BERDER to come to East BERLIN between 7 and 20 January 1956, in order to meet with won PAULUS. The strengthening of the ADS in West Germany and the strengthening of the ties between the East and West segments of the ADS would better serve the aims of the ADS. These aims are reunification, free trade, and better understanding between East and West Cermany.
- f. The conference ended at approximately 0230 neurs, and in bidding HCEHER and Source farewell, von PAULUS stated that although he, von PAULUS, knew that BERGER was a "hard-headed Swabian", Source should arrange for BERGER to ccme to BERLIN.
- g. Source and RCEHAI, driven by the same chauffour in the same car which had brought thom, returned to LEIPHIG at approximately 0430 hours on the imporning of 11 December 1955. During the trip from DRELLED to LEFFEIC, Source yand ECEHER discussed the general political situation and the problems which would have to be worked out before reunification could be effected. HOLENA mentioned no tasks for Source, nor dis he request any information from him. " ROER'R stated that any expenses for trips BERTER or Source might make to East Sermany in connection with his, HCERER's or won FAULUS! requests, would be paid for by the ADS, East Germany; furthermore, any wager Source would lose by being absent from his suployment would be reimbursed. ECEMBE stated that he would not be able to arrange for anyone to show their wares in the Spring Pair in LEIPHIG. "I Remover, if anyone from the ADD desired to have display upace he should contact the official fair office, LEIC to, and make arrangements. In the event sembers

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of the ADS did make such arrangements, Scurce should notify SDEJECT, who would do what he could to help them after space allotments had been made.

- h. Upon their arrival in LEIPZIC, SUBJECT and Source retired in SUBJECT apartment. At approximately 0830, 11 December 1955, SUBJECT took Source to the railroad station, LEIPZIC, and gave him 50 DM East to pay for the return trip to STUTTGART. Source arrived in STUTTGART by fast interzonal train at approximately 1900 hours, 11 December 1955, having crossed the border without incident.
- i. Source described Fnu FEUTEL, von PATLUS' valut and Adjutant, as approximately 30 to 35 years of age, 5'll" tall, stout build, black hair, and not wearing glasses. BEUTEL seldom spoke during the meeting; however, he tended to von PAULUS' every wish and whim.

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
