REPORT OF FINDINGS		
<p>At 1730 hours, on 23 March 1956, a surveillance of Otto Ausermeier, born 23 September 1921 in Vilsbiburg (now), Germany, presently residing at Stuttgart (NY 1303), Germany, Hoelderlinstrasse 23, was initiated in an effort to determine whether Ausermeier contacted SUBJECT at any time during the weekend 23-25 March 1956. The surveillance, conducted during the following periods, failed to reveal any pertinent activity on the part of Ausermeier:</p> <p>23 March 1956: At 1815 hours, Ausermeier departed his place of employment, Moser Auto House, Stuttgart, Talstrasse 50, and traveled by street car to Stuttgart, Hegelstrasse, where he debarked and walked to his home. Surveillance was maintained until 2330 hours but Ausermeier was not seen.</p> <p>24 March 1956: Surveillance was initiated at 0500 hours but Ausermeier was not observed until 0610 hours, when he departed from his home and boarded a street car which took him to his place of employment. At 1230 hours, Ausermeier departed his place of employment and traveled by street car to Hegelstrasse and then by foot to his residence.</p> <p>At 1520 hours, Ausermeier, his wife and child departed their home, and walked to Hegelstrasse where they boarded a street car traveling in the direction of the center of Stuttgart. The Ausermeier family was lost to the surveillance, which was then transferred to the vicinity of the Main Railroad Station in Stuttgart.</p> <p>At 1700 hours, the surveillance was transferred to the vicinity of Ausermeier's home and at 1715 hours, Ausermeier was observed walking to a grocery store located at the corner of Seidenstrasse, and Hegelstrasse and returning to his home at 1725.</p> <p>At 1830 hours, Ausermeier and a child, approximately four years of age, departed from his home and walked through the neighborhood until 1700 hours, when they returned home. Ausermeier was not seen again and the surveillance was discontinued at 2400 hours.</p> <p>25 March 1956: Surveillance was initiated at 0500 hours and was continued until 2330 hours, during which time Ausermeier was not seen. A light was on in Ausermeier's apartment from 2000 to 2120 hours, but no activity was noted.</p> <p>AGENT'S NOTE: Ausermeier was extremely cautious throughout the period of the surveillance during which he was in sight. He constantly looked around him, in store windows and in all vehicles. It is believed that Ausermeier was conscious of the surveillance from the time he and his family boarded the streetcar on 24 March 1956.</p>
