4. REPORT OF FINDINGS

At 1730 hours, on 23 March 1956, a surveillance of Otto Aussermeier, born 23 September 1921 in Vilabiburg (noa), Germany, presently residing at Stuttgart (HV 1303), Germany, Hoelderlinstrasse 23, was initiated in an effort to determine whether Aussermeier contacted SUBJECT at any time during the weekend 23-25 March 1956. The surveillance, conducted during the following periods, failed to reveal any pertinent activity on the part of Aussermeier:

25 March 1956: At 1815 hours, Aursermeier departed his place of employment, Moser Auto House, Stuttgart, Talstrasse 50, and traveled by street car to Stuttgart, Hegelstrasse, where he debarked and walked to his home. Surveillance was maintained until 2530 hours but Aussermeier was not seen.

24 March 1956: Surveillance was initiated at 0500 boars but insermeter was not observed until 0610 hours, when he departed from his home and boarded a street our which took him to his place of employment. At 1250 hours, insermeter departed his place of employment and traveled by street our to Regeletrasse and then by foot to his residence.

At 1520 hours, insermeier, his wife and child departed their home, and walked to Regulatrasse where they boarded a street our traveling in the direction of the center of Stuttgart. The insermeier family was lost to the surveillance, which was then transferred to the vicinity of the Main Railroad Station in Stuttgart.

At 1700 hours, the surveillance was transferred to the ricinity of Aussermeier's home and at 1715 hours, Assermeier was observed walking to a grocery store located at the corner of Seidenstrasse and Hagelstrasse and returning to his home at 1725.

At 1650 hours, Aussermaier and a child, approximately four years of age, departed from his home and walked through the neighborhood until 1700 hours, when they returned home. Aussermaier was not seen again and the surveillance was discontinued at 2400 hours.

25 March 1956: Surveillance was initiated at 0500 hours and was continued until 2330 hours, during which time Aussermeier was not seen. A light was on in Aussermeier's apartment from 2000 to 2120 hours, but no activity was noted.

ACENT'S NOTE: Aussermeier was extremely cautious throughout the period of the surveillance during which he was in eight. He constantly looked around him, in store windows and in all vehicles. It is believed that Aussermeier was conscious of the surveillance from the time he and his family boarded the streetoar on 24 March 1950.
