On 15 February 1957, Source A-POSTGT revealed a letter from SUBJECT to Source B-POSTGT, translation of which is as follows:</p> <p>Dear Comrade</p> <p>Today I will write you a few lines in a hurry. I hope that you have received my last letter in which I informed you that I would only be able to see you in the middle of February. I have been waiting for an answer but apparently you have had just as little time as I.</p> <p>I would appreciate it very much if you could come to B. next Thursday or Friday. I will be there from the 21st until the 23rd of February but I will be tied up nearly all day on Saturday, the 23rd, by a congress. Please inform me as soon as possible whether you can take time off and when you will arrive. It would be best if we meet in the Mitropa, Friedrichstrasse station.</p> <p>A friend of mine will again mail the letter in the Federal Republic so that you will receive it as quickly as possible.</p> <p>I hope that you, and above all your wife and children, are well. I have had very many worries and troubles from a sickness and a bad automobile accident (illegible). My nice car was quite badly smashed up but it is fixed up again like new.</p> <p>Everything else verbally. I look forward to seeing you again. | <p>2. On 18 February 1957, Source B-POSTGT, per his telephonic request, was met and related the following information:</p> <p>Former SS General Gottlob Berger, residing at Moosburg (NU 4426), had called Source by phone on the evening of 15 February 1957 requesting that Source contact him personally as soon as possible. On 16 February 1957, Source travelled to Berger's home in Moosburg where he ascertained that Berger had received a letter from SUBJECT on 15 February 1957. The letter allegedly requested Berger or Source to come to East Berlin (OU 9220), for urgent conferences to be held. Nature of the conferences was not known. In the letter, ROEMER had specified that he would be in East Berlin on Thursday and Friday, 21 and 22 February 1957. ROEMER further indicated that he might possibly be able to remain in East Berlin through Saturday, 23 February 1957. Source plans to leave Stuttgart at approximately 1640 hours, 21 February 1957, in Berger's stead because Berger allegedly has too much work at present to afford his leaving his job to make the meeting. Source indicated that he would arrive in East Berlin about 0540 hours, 22 February 1957. Source plans to return to Stuttgart on 23 February 1957.
