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ANALYSIS OF THE NECESSITY OF A CENTRAL AMERICAN INTELLIGENCE SERVICE.

Warfare of today, and even more that of the future, will not fundamentally from the manner in which world war II has been won. Between 1939 and 1945, it shall be referred to much in this study, to the new weapons, as atomic bombs and rockets, although these will establish utterly different conditions; but a stress shall be laid upon the entire administrative structure of a war to come. In world war II, mobilization and submarine-based movement, have already been played a considerable role. In the next war, these factors will be decisive, for it has been无可避免ly proved that a war against Russia can't be decided by mere military means.

There is no doubt that America has clearly recognized these suppositions and will be acting accordingly. But it can be pretended with the same certainty, that the USA have not shown even any starting points in this line, save some poor attempt of few little branch-offices of the USA in Europe, Italy, and Africa. An explanation, that owing to experiences of the corresponding German authorities, during first world war - was, by the way, the cause of having, for the USA, at least a certain state of balance between the States and Europe.

Perhaps in November 1, Hoffmeyer has given order to the activity of the German secret service to directed explicitly against the Soviet Union. In a typical section of military counter espionage and foreign intelligence (SA), according to the principles of that time, it had been agreed, that there, ought to provide information and security, that is not one single exception to this in either of these two persons, namely, that von Schleicher, Hoffmeyer and his co-conspirator, Schmitz, had to be provided with all information about the Soviet's military and commercial production, industry and the interior politics, unconditionally, but they were also to be handicapped, so that could not possibly affect the other members of government, especially the Foreign Minister, and the Foreign Office, through their own disclosure, or through disclosure of their subordinates. 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feld secret service and its lines to the Russian frontier territories have been functioning satisfactorily (by means of the so called double reconnaissance formations).

Authorities of the German secret service had clearly recognized these deficiencies. They were of the opinion, that only by strictest centralization of the whole intelligence and infiltration service in question, certain success could be guaranteed. This centralization has been longed for a long time owing to the well-known interior political situation and also the creation of a uniform German intelligence service in 1947, directed by Mr. Schellenberg, has remained in the end a mere theoretical matter. The results attained, since this reformation, justified however the conception that only a centralized secret service offered the necessary suppositions for the success. Such an undivided secret service had to comprise all lines of military, political and economical intelligence services, moreover a kind of General Staff for organization of partisans and underground movements, as well as a central department for secret propaganda.

The American intelligence service in Europe has not shown any uniformity or centralizing up till now. There are various departments, working side by side, and devoted, or pretending to be devoted, to the same task, but also they are competing with one another, as if they were rivals of enemy countries. There has been a slogan in the "Third Reich" saying: "When anybody would demonstrate his good connection to the German leading circles he told that he had received orders directly from Berlin". An American modification of this slogan is in existence now, only today it is "the orders from Frankfurt". Thus dozens of different departments are working at the same objectives without knowing of each other, competing, each other, in most cases without any coordination. It could be objected that on account of control parallel working of so many different lines should be precluded. But this rather doesn't apply to the case, as not any of the departments is able to work in such a large scope... It would be necessary, in a writer of fact, these departments in Europe via an office in migration to collect material from the eastern border, according to all sources of information about the concerned objectives.

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A correct judgement of the emigrants, free from over-or-underestimation, is an indispensable supposition for an efficient intelligence service; the blindness of every political emigration is, apart from a natural bias of judgment, the fact that their political and mental conception seems to be bounded in the moment they passed the frontier. The view of the country situation in the moment when they left, will remain unalterably in their mind; changes happening since will not be recognized. Moreover the splitting up into several parties, as they used to do at home, will hardly carry on abroad and even specialized.

It is a particularity with South-eastern emigrants that their political struggle is showing in a far degree an appalling likeness to the fightings of aliens or bands. That means, that every struggle has a personal background in such a measure as it would be unimaginable under western European conditions. Therefore every little group of emigrants is declaring all other compatriots as doubtful or even as disguised enemy agents, especially when dealing with foreign authorities, who have to give any money or support. Therefore the emigrants' judgements and conceptions should never be accepted as impartial or reliable, so it would be the wrong way to build up an intelligence service predominantly with the help of emigrants. It is imperative that the emigrants' propositions and conceptions are scrutinized without any exception by experienced (not merely cheerfully trained) specialists, of another nationality. Every intelligence service must be absolutely free in his decisions from influence of the emigration. Another most important point is the heavy infiltration, now in progress, among circles, by the NKWD or other secret police of the concerned countries. This requires special care, only a person which is regarded for many years with a circle of emigrants is able to judge how far he can be trusted. Just a classical example showing how an agreement in cooperation with emigrant groups may be disturbed by the action of just the ROTACOM (redaction) group in Germany. From the fall of 1945 it can be believed, the Siedlergruppe secret police had been in close cooperation forming worldwide an organization, now, headed by an American office in Frankfurt. Reports about the Nazi-republik movement in Slovakia didn't come from the local underground of the Nazi's resistance movement, but from the NKWD. Notwithstanding, the Red Cross offices are indispensable organizations. The secret service, propaganda, intelligence, especially in the field of the military liaison, etc.

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Such note important are the resistance groups in the various countries. They must be activated, their true resistance movement is however built on other kind of persons than those presented by the emigration representatives to the functionaries of the foreign countries. An native, hitherto unknown man who is able to establish a resistance group without any support, frequently by the most primitive means, is much more important than the holder of a once famous name, or the holder of high office, who has saved himself by escaping to a foreign country. The former Hungarian prime Minister Nagy is an example. His party, rather insignificant at the end of the war, has suddenly become the most important group of the country, owing to the pro-people and anti-Cold War attitude of its Hungarian population. The most hypocritical groups and power-chasing jellies in this party, in no time, lost all its credibility at the first blow. The party leader, Nagy, a unimportant personality who has been hated by the whole people because of his collaboration with the Russians and his breaking all cruelties and bloodsheds against the anti-Communists, escaped under untiring conditions and is now represented apparently as the spiritual leader of the Hungarian liberty movement. With his name not a single fighter can be won in Hungary, in the contrary, every power, backing him, would suffer a heavy loss of prestige. There are many similar cases, were the USA has been showing off the wrong persons.

In the following will be tried, to make a constructive suggestion, first in a small corps, probably a reformation in great style or a creation of a uniform American secret service must be expected for some time.

Creation of a Headquarters, comprising subsections. This Headquarters must be directed immediately from Washington until a native American Intelligence service shall be created. By this arrangement into the internal American dissensions in Brazil will be evolved. Headquarters had to comprise the following sections:

Creation of a Headquarter, comprising all sections. This Headquarter must be directed immediately from Washington, until a uniform American Intelligence service will be created. The construction of the former three nations is clear. Its objective is an extent offensive secret service against Russia and all Russian-occupied territories.

A division according to the various nationalities will be useful. National minorities in Russian occupied territories may be taken into account for various reasons. Separate handling of such territories might prove serviceable. For instance, the Baltic States, White-Russia, Ukraine, the various Caucasian Tribes, Turkestan etc., in short for all peoples, whose history shows a true striving for independence. The construction of the various South-eastern and Balkan States must be similar. The independence feeling of these peoples is proved by the existence of their resistance movements. It must be tried to get into connection as soon as possible with the authorities in the various countries by the aid of the opposition in these countries or by special agents. For the first way the help of the respective emigration group will be necessary, but a severe selection had to be done by experts. Without these experts' work, any opposition or emigration can be used because it would mean running the risk to come under the influence of politicians, pursuing egotistical and frequently obscure purposes. There are not so many specialists in Europe, acquainted with Russia, Eastern-middle and Southern Europe, in any case never that would be wanted. Only a long intimacy with the problems, the countries and the important persons and certain experience will qualify the agents for an activity in a secret service. There is no possibility of a short training for such specialists - it is impossible to get the necessary knowledge about the complicated problems and personal relations of these territories within a short time. The employment of German officials will be unavoidable for this reason. The point they have formerly served the "Third Reich" ought not to be overlooked.

The main element of intelligence is more a technical than a political or political function have been here in the liaison secret service working abroad, among them the anti-Soviet at 10 o'clock, has been predominant. It may not be forgotten that most of attempts to end the second world war by a compromise with the German Powers have been started by the very leaders and persons of the German intelligence service.

The defensive section (not to be confounded with the Counter-intelligence service) has to make use of the information available in the country where it resides, that is in the first line, the

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reports brought in by embassies and the current news of refugees from the Eastern States. A few Sub-sections could be added, which would be able to work freely and unimpededly in their line. For instance a Press and Radio Sub-section, the Press and the Broadcasting of every country has to be controlled systematically and currently. Experience has shown the immense value of such a well-functioning section. The most unobtrusive items in Press and Broadcasting, telling nothing to the non-expert, can frequently be of decisive importance in the contemplation of a substantial problem. A specialist in the Defensive section had to do the wireless and deciphering services. The Germans have had extraordinary success in collaboration with a corresponding department of the Hungarian General Staff during last world war. This follower of the famous Austrian-Hungarian Deciphering Corps, of the first world war, had established with the most modest means an extent and very efficient Anti-wireless and Deciphering Service. The wireless connections of many embassies and military commanding posts had been regularly controlled and deciphered. These specialists, most of them Hungarians, are living nearly all in Austria.

The Section Nr.5 (Organisation of resistance movements) will presumably not be established in a larger scale, fitting the political situation. But it must be prepared as soon as possible to be able to take up work in full extent at the right moment. This section had to be organised like a General Staff, to enable it to built up military commanding posts for partisan activities in the countries involved. There must be clear notions about the military possibilities and the very potentialities of a partisan army.

centers etc., must be recorded, Reports of Weapons and ammunitions must be carefully prepared as well as airfix is, departure points etc. A head-topic in this section must be the preparation of sabotage actions. These would be the essential factor of warfare when there are no Guerrilla formations. The start could be made in coordination with the offensive information section, just now (recommending of important bridges, narrow passages etc., which could be blocked for a long time by blowing up). Should the situation grow critical, but means when an armed conflict can not be avoided, this section would become most important, as all the others would only have auxiliary character. Sabotage preparation with the purpose to start a guerrilla war or a broad battle in the right moment would spare some hundred thousand soldiers for the USA and her

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allies.

The USA propaganda has turned out rather effective in the Western States up till now, but it must be reckoned that the effect of this propaganda will be decreasing when the Communists succeed in cutting off the influences of the Western world in prohibition of listening in broadcasts of the Western states on gain of unequal punishment, and the suppression of all western papers would leave the Eastern population without any news about the real situation. To provide for this case is one of the principle tasks of the propaganda section. The propaganda of the several resistance groups can be prepared and coordinated by Headquarters at the general level. The issue of illegal pamphlets can be started at once. As long as they can't be produced in the concerned countries, they must be printed by the Headquarters. On reasons of circumspection they must look as if they had been printed and issued in the respective country. They must be made in a technical primitive manner, otherwise would be only hectoring. Informations about daily topics must be brought in such way that they can't be attributed to any Headquarters. The establishment of illegal broadcasting stations like the former so-called Czech Radio (an illegal German station), and stations distributing political news is necessary. If the stations can be moved they may be located in the respective countries. A propaganda campaign with the purpose of demoralizing American and other Eastern troops must be started. All means of cooperation must be applied, for instance by a Belgian Socialist paper of writing that article would be of greatest effect, at the very moment when the national feelings are accentuated and the rule the people is compelled to play for Russian Imperialistic interests. There are various possibilities, that could be pitted against the New-Form and vice versa. One pamphlet about Stalin, bringing him down, either to write in such a pronounced anti-Sovietic way as is popular among all peoples,

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radio operators, couriers etc., all must be trained in this section before they begin their job. The responsibility of the training is accordingly great. Their usefulness is very high. The time of training depends on the kind of job. A Courier will be fit within a few weeks. Not so a Radio operator. Even if he has undergone an elementary training, he will need many months until he is able to handle one.

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very in his assignments also under the most difficult circumstances. Needless to say it is important that the training of such agents must be begun as soon as possible. Only a few men are fit for this task as experience has shown, with regard to an actual warfare, capable and reliable agents must be trained, who could be employed in American trustee in the various partisan circles, American and British citizens, who served in their Army during the present war, to identify the importance of the above mentioned. All experiences made by the American agent, the first war could be applied in the training, power and service. Also the experience acquired in the service of "Georgians" and "Jugdverbunde."

Probably such a plan might be realized in a large scale during the next time. Any such plan will result in fictions as long as no uniform, strictly centralized American intelligence service has been created. It is believed that the present method will not give any results. It will correctly be justified to keep up of agent activities in Europe now, to publish news to be informative for the American officers are produced at the "Newspapers" in Frankfort, Berlin, or Bremen. In the best case they are picked out of the Newspapers of the Eastern States, then transformed, when they are not a pure product of flight, of which are sold for 50 Dollars. One must know the methods of American officers, fighting against each other. The usual capture of especially capable agents is considered as a herald, intelligence, is sent into the competing American organization, living false information which are used to prove the liability of the competitor. When good agents can't be paralysed by other means, in a court procedure offers them drugs or insultant bring them in conflict with the law. Then the offender can be denegated to the police, and arrested. The connection between the American agents in Europe to the FBI, except in one of the most terrible and dangerous occurrences, even if in the charge of English, French, German or Austrian currency, the collaboration of the public market by H.M.T. agent is sufficient. It has been proved in many cases, that an infiltration of members of their own body resulted in this way.

Attention must be given to other members of these organizations, especially practical, when the English, Germany and Austria, the Americans, Belgians, French, Dutch, Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, etc., etc., and, which is important and after the names of the countries, are placed in the following:

The clandestine Agent of the NKVD agents in Europe believe that it is the duty of NKVD Agents to conduct various cover, esp., and it is the desire of NKVD Agent German organization, Agency, the infiltration of the Black Market by NKVD Agent is evident. It has been proved in many cases, that an infiltration of members of their has been reached in this way.

Justice must be given to other American offices there such as, though are not exercised, which are in the contrary, and developing in a generous way the formulated plans. There is influence in Upper Austria, which has realized considerable success with an agent intelligence organization, in the Eastern States and has

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installed the first agents school. Pre this school excellent men have been sent out carrying out the above mentioned plan. It would be advisable to make use of this basis while you'd ignore the trouble of another start. The "Iron Curtain" could be pierced with the least difficulty from this area. The South-East of Europe is the best place for intelligence work against Russia. Should this plan to be taken into consideration, it may be stated that the basis of such an objective is-existent. Trustworthy emigrants from all concerned countries and connections with resistance groups in various of these countries are available. There are as well trustworthy specialists for nearly all lines, including radio operators, deciphering specialists, all willing to work for a competent American authority. In view of the present situation there is not much time to loose.

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
