SUBJECT: Radio equipment found in Houding Lodge at 196-180-10.
TO: CG, SOI, Twelfth Army Group.

Examination of the radio equipment found by the
Central at STYRALING revealed nothing of unusual interest. It
consisted of one standard 350 watt transmitter of Hungarian manu-
facture covering a frequency band of 190-1900 Kcs. The antenna
wires between 15 and 16 meters in length. With this equipment an
American Super Skyriter receiver is connected. The receiver is
model developed five or six years ago in America. The transmitter is
a relatively new model but of standard design. Both transmitter and
receiver are vacuum drivers, but capable of being powered by either
developing either 110 or 220 volts A.C. The equipment also
included a second Halliconfer Super Skyriter receiver, a small
3 1/2" built receiver and 100 watt transmitter, built by a technician
mechanic about 3 months ago. All of this equipment is of a usual
sort and contains nothing new or unusual.

A third transmitter which had been found in a truck for
transport was removed about 19 or 20 May 1945. It was
a Hungarian make, and was presented as property of the Red Army
for the removal of the equipment to Hungary for use by the
Hungarian Army.

The one item found which may give to be of technical
interest was a cipher machine used by the Central for communication
with Berlin. This machine is being turned over to the
Signal Intelligence of HQ, Twelfth Army Group.

All equipment found was inventoried and stored. The
radio station has been well constructed and equipped. It is capable
of issuing to and continuing operation. Pending decision as to the
disposition of this equipment, the room in which it is stored has
been locked and sealed by the local CIC Detachment.
