- 4. In the course of the shifting of personnel, after the events of the 20 May had precipitated the analgamation of the Abwell apparatus, Oberatheuthant I.G. KLEYNSTUBEER was sent to Spain. This may have given rise to the erroneous impression that Amt VI was beginning to Lay the ground work for a post-war information not in Spain. According to Dr. HOTTL such implications could be read into KLEYNSTUBBER's assignment only in ignorance of the following alreadatances:
- 4. a). Oberstleutnant I.C. KLEYNGTURIER was not a non of CCHELLERIEG's confidence. The fact that he had fought in the Spanish Civil War with the Legion Condor and that he had good connections with the Falange may have qualified him for the job. The underlying consideration in transferring to Spain was, however, that SCHELLENBERG intensely distrusted officers who had held responsible positions in the Ambehr and who had been close to Oberst i.G. LANSEN. SCHELLENBERG once mentioned to Dr. HOTTE that he felt he could trust or one among the leading functionaries of the old Absolut, with the exception of Oberst i.G. OHLETZ.

I.O. 's Comment:

Ironically enough Oberst i.G. OHERE was up to his need in the communication of the 20 July (see KUERART report), Whereas KLEYMERHIBER was surpeated and distiked by Oberst HENSEN because of the intimate commentions he had with the SD (see ibid).

b. The official policy of Int VI did not evince may partiality towards the Falange. The only Ant VI pipe line to that organisation, Dr. HOTTL knows about, was possibly handled by Sturmbannfuchrer MOSIG (VI B, RSHA). Remon HONER, France's one-time Foreign Minister, worked for SCHELLEND PG on purely personal basis without political background (see special report on the SUNER connection.).
