Name traces of Kurt JACOB and Wolf S. JACOB

- The following information from the files of the Vienna Station concerning Kurt Jacob, is submitted in reply to your request for traces on JACOB, fam. Kurt J. JACOB was being considered for operational use by this station in 1950 but at present we have no interest. London's files contain a trace of material on him.

Material compiled from London war zone documents, dated 1948, describes JACOB as follows: Born June 3, 1908 at Leitstall, Austria. Married Maria (nee Brink), no child. Wife is a doctor of medicine, lives at Austria, Austria. Nationality is Austrian. Religion is Roman Catholic. Location: height 5'8"; dark, slightly wavy hair; weight approximately 150 pounds; big nose, gloved pointed toes; low nose, wide forehead, blue eyes, dark blond wavy hair; exact military posture; speech is slow, precise, professional in manner. Languages known are German, French, Polish, Czech. Mouth is delicate; he has gold teeth, two stomach wounds, and only one lung.

Professional soldier; served in World War I with Austro-Hungarian Army; became lieutenant. After war JACOB attended University of Vienna. Lieutenant at 1931 and director of Army Institute of Sciences at Vienna. Dismissed from service with honor brought him degradation and dishonor from service. The reason was that he was a carrier of the anti-Nazi "disband" and "ignominy of blood" (grandfather Jewish). With German invasion of Poland, called back into Army as a private. Was commissioned and taken into Wehrmacht through assistance of old friend Oberst (later General) v. Lubowicz, Chief, Wehr II. By 1941 he was a Major.

Wehr II in April, 1941 was headed by Oberst Baron Freytag, close friend of the family. JACOB was commissioned by Freytag to organize the Leitstall II staff with headquarters at Vienna.
