<p>The following information was obtained by Informant 6433 from Rudolf Springer-Teichzil, an acquaintance of SUBJECT who is presently employed by SUBJECT in the gathering of intelligence. Evaluation: Source "D", Sub-source "D", Information "3".</p> <p>In late December 1951, HOETTI approached Springer with the request that Springer aid HOETTI in gathering information for a West German intelligence organization. HOETTI explained that he needed Springer, since Springer was already an active member of the National League. HOETTI did not explain in detail the name, activity or purpose of the intelligence service for which he worked, but said that he was in contact with a man in Heidelberg, Germany, who was deeply and exclusively interested in foreign affairs.</p> <p>On Springer's agreeing to work with HOETTI, HOETTI gave him the following ESIs:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> What contact does the Austrian NI have in Western Germany? In what manner and to what degree do the Soviets use the NI to work into Western Germany? What personal ties does Dr. Adolf Slavik have with persons in Western Germany? Is Dr. Slavik in contact with Ami Korschmann, a former German Polizei-general who recently returned to Munich from imprisonment in a Polish PW camp? Korschmann, according to HOETTI, allegedly works for the Deutsche Soldatenzeitung in Bonn, and has the same assignment from the Soviets with regard to Western Germany, as has Dr. Slavik with regard to Austria. <p>In addition to answering the above ESIs, Springer was given the following additional assignments:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Exploration of NI nets in Western Germany and the discovery of the persons working those nets. The exploration of the "Soviet threads" which run into Western Germany and back. Preparation of a basic report on the NI with particular reference to the degree to which they are preparing the road for communication in Austria. Names of the more important functionaries and descriptions of their activities are to be included in this report.
