1. It is desired that a discreet investigation be conducted on Dr Wolfgang (Wolf) Justin HANTHORN, born on 22 October 1894 in KAS KIRREIT am Main, residing at MUNICH 13, Daimlerstrasse 5. A member of the BKA Office, SUBJECT is associated with the Institut fuer Gegenwartsforschung.

2. During World War I, SUBJECT performed army service in Turkey. Following the war SUBJECT was a prisoner of war in Egypt, and subsequently lived in Argentina for several years. During World War II SUBJECT served in the Brandenburg Division. The commanding officer of a Stabskompanie in August 1940, SUBJECT became commanding officer of 2 Kompanie II Battalion, Lehrregiment Brandenburg in February 1941. SUBJECT was wounded in the hand while serving with 2 Kompanie in Russia in the summer of 1941. In late 1941 SUBJECT was commanding officer of 3 Kompanie II Battalion Lehrregiment Brandenburg at LVG. In January 1943 HANTHORN was a member of z.b.V 600 of the Brandenburg Division. SUBJECT allegedly attained the rank of Major.

3. In October 1952 SUBJECT reportedly acted as a letter drop for Gerhard WILHELM, Tudi SCHAFF, Dr. KILLI KOLLER, Sergei FEDOROV or the Institut fuer Gegenwartsforschung. In view of this, technical coverage on SUBJECT was instituted. In December 1952 a member of the BKA Office, SUBJECT kept in contact with Gerhard WILHELM and Hormann KOLLER from the Institut fuer Gegenwartsforschung in MUNICH. In February 1953 SUBJECT was described as a writer opposed to the remilitarization of Western Germany, and, as such, a personality of interest to the Verlag der Nation, official publishing house of the KDP. HANTHORN may have been considered a possible sympathizer by the KDP.

4. A sister of HANTHORN by the name of Stasi HANTHORN resided in 1943 at MUNICH 13, Daimlerstrasse 5.
