SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

One M/Sgt. HENRY DI MAGLIO, ASN 6855269, was at Office of the Military Attache, American Embassy, Prague, Czechoslovakia, in 1947. No information that he was there in 1939. No record of M/Sgt. DI MAGLIO at U. S. Army, State Department, or at two government agencies which conduct intelligence and security investigations.

DETAILS: AT WASHINGTON, D. C.

In an interview with SAs HARVEY V. PETERS and FRANCIS J. FRASER in Detroit, Michigan, on April 13, 1955, subject advised that he was a Polish citizen and had co-operated with the Polish Ambassador in Prague, Czechoslovakia, in 1939 at the time of the Nazi occupation of Czechoslovakia. He also stated that he was acquainted with an employee of the United States Embassy in Prague whose name was DIMAGLIO, who is presently residing in Florida.

In 1948, Confidential Informant T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, in connection with another investigation identified one

HENRY DI NEGLIO, Army serial number 6855269, care of American Embassy, Office of Military Attache, Army Post Office 696, care of Postmaster, New York, in December, 1947. T-1 furnished no additional information concerning Master Sergeant HENRY DI NEGLIO.

Mr. RICHARD G. JOHNSON, Czechoslovakian Desk Officer, Department of State, advised on May 9, 1955, that he has ascertained from sources at the Department of State, available to him, that a person known as Master Sergeant DI NEGLIO was at the American Embassy, Prague, Czechoslovakia, in 1947. Mr. JOHNSON further advised that he was unable to find any information to show that this Master Sergeant DI NEGLIO was at the American Embassy in 1939.

Mr. JOHNSON also commented that in his opinion, it was improbable that the Master Sergeant DI NEGLIO referred to by him was at the American Embassy in Prague, Czechoslovakia, in 1939, because he was quite sure that this fact would be known to the State Department.

A search of the records of enlisted men and officers of the United States Army on active duty, as maintained at the Pentagon, disclosed no record of Master Sergeant DI NEGLIO, Army serial number 6855269, according to information made available to SE MELVIN L. MONTGOMERY on May 11, 1955.

On June 7, 1955, Mrs. JAMES BLAKEMORE, Department of the Army, advised SE XAVIER F. CLARK that there is no specific file of attache employees of United States Embassies unless they are public officials.

No record of Master Sergeant DI NEGLIO, Army serial number 6855269, was located in the active and inactive files of the Foreign Service records of the Department of State, according to information made available by Mrs. DOROTY MARSHALL, Clerk, Personnel Records, Department of State, on May 24, 1955, to SA JOSEPH W. SPEICHER.

No record identifiable with Master Sergeant DI NEGLIO was located at the Passport Office, Department of State, according to information made available to SA KENNETH J. HASER on May 23, 1955.

Confidential Informant T-2, another Government agency which conducts intelligence and security investigations, advised

on May 31, 1955, that no record identifiable with Master Sergeant HENRY DI MEGLIO could be located.
