SUBJECT: Mikulas HOLEJKO

1. Reference is made to your request for information regarding Subject (File No. A-8-188-286) dated December 10, 1954.

2. Memoranda regarding Subject of your request were transmitted on 21 January 1953 and 25 March 1954 to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, at which time copies were also sent to the Immigration and Naturalization Service.

✓ 3. A further check of CS/CIA files reveal information from a usually reliable source, dated June 1950, concerning one Ing. Nestor HOLEJKO. HOLEJKO is described as being middle-aged, bald headed with only a fringe of darkish hair around his head. Subject is said to be of Ukrainian origin who lived in Czechoslovakia until 1945. He then escaped to Austria or Switzerland, and the then already largely Communist controlled Ministry of Interior in Prague formally demanded his extradition from Switzerland should he be found there. He was alleged to have acted as a denouncer of Czech patriots to the Nazi occupants during the war and also to be a Trotskyite. The report further states that it may be that the Communist Ministry of Interior invented the allegation that HOLEJKO was a Nazi informer in order to lay its hands on a Trotskyite wanted by Moscow. The report also states that one Ing. Nestor HOLEJKO was working with a Left wing Socialist group and with French intelligence in Innesbruck.

4. The files of CS/CIA also reveal information from a usually reliable source, dated January 1953, concerning one Dr. Longin HOLEIKO. Dr. HOLEIKO, who was formerly a lawyer with the American Court in Munich, was reported to be living in Canada with his father-in-law. He is a Ukrainian Trotskyite and financial supporter of Vpered, a paper published by the URDP-Left. This report also states that Engineer Nestor HOLEJKO, brother of Dr. HOLEIKO, was a former agent of the French Intelligence and a Trotskyite who emigrated to Chicago and works in a radio factory owned by an American of Czech origin.
