He did admit that Major HUBER who held the rank of Police Attache of the German Embassy, was from Berlin Gestapo hqs. He assumed that HUBER had agents although he did not know their identities. von RANDOW advised that when HUBER first arrived in Shanghai there were conflicts between Col. MEISINGER and HUBER. HUBER desired to send his reports direct to Germany and not to be under the jurisdiction of MEISINGER at all. HUBER used the Embassy wireless facilities and did not have his own codes; according to von RANDOW the information which HUBER submitted to Germany was mere gossip. When unfavorable reports were received concerning any Germans HUBER never took action. In fact von RANDOW set forth examples of the kindness of HUBER von RANDOW had no knowledge of any representative of the Sicherheitsdienst who was collecting military, economic and naval information. ... KAHNER was Police Attache in Shanghai prior to the arrival of Major HUBER... (v. RANDOW) admitted, however, that all reports of HUBER passed through his hands." Agent YEX-18 (eval D-3) advised that in his opinion v. RANDOW was "the man behind the scenes" of German intel. in China; at one time YEX-18 took reports to HUBER which HUBER felt were too "hot" for him to handle and referred YEX-18 to v. RANDOW, who then instructed YEX-18 to conduct investigations.

YPX 260, 4 Feb 46: 'After 29 Jul 44, Major HUBER, head of Gestapo in Shanghai, came to Peiping to intensify Gestapo activities. He appointed Dr. Walter FUCHS to become "Watchman" of the North Town District and Catholic University and Prof. HUWER "watchman" of the German Hospital patients and personnel. At this time HUBER sent a cable Berlin stating that Peking was a Gestapo net and that nob could escape. When HUBER came to Peking he forgot his co book and had to use the EHRHARDT Bureau code. EHRHARDT, head of the Abwehr in Shanghai was here at the same time and was aksed by HUBER to reprimand a German U-boat commar because he was living in a home owned by a Jew and oft spoke against the Nazis. During the conversation with th U-boat commander he brought up the story about the cable that HUBER sent.' (Source: Hedda HAMMAR, Peiping.)

Memo dtd 28 Jan 46 identifies attached material on German Diplomatic and Consular Personnel in China as obtained from a Japanese document from files of Foreign Section of Shanghai Municipal Police, reliably reported as mostly furnished to Japanese authorities by German Govt.

(1) Helmuth KOCH, intelligence assistant in Shanghai to HUBER and reportedly a Gestapo agent.

(2) Jutta MAUERER, private secretary to Police Major HUBER.

(3) Major Franz HUBER. Police Attache to the German Embassy Hqs in Berlin. (HUBER's) quarrels with Col. Josef MEISINGER, who claimed to be chief Police Attache for the entire Far East, are well known. HUBER stated that he reported directly to Berlin and that he did not have to take orders from MEISINGER. HUBER is also known to have quarreled frequently with Lt. Col. Ludwig EHRHARDT* and other members of the latter's organization on the subject of jurisdiction.

(*Chief of well-known EHRHARDT Bureau and head Abwehr Intelligence rep in China; his org known as Kriegs-Organization/KO) SECRET
