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| a. | famous. He moved quite a lot in local German Taipei circles one of his social intimates being Herr v. BEHRING, then in charge of 'Bayer' interests in the Far East. There is no doubt that HUBER was the local chief of the so-called 'regular' gestapo and that his direct superior was Police-Colonel MEISINGER in Tokio, and at one time 'Commissioner-General' for the Far East', in which capacity he had the right to give orders even to German Ambassadors and ministers in this part of the world. On the other hand, from a certain knowledge of Nazi secret service methods, I (SOI:Dr. Ernst Alfred Halper) have serious doubts whether HUBER was in fact the highest ranking Nazi secret service operative in the city. In Germany there existed above the gestapo, and as some sort of control-organ of the latter, the so-called SD (Sicherheitsdienst), an organization under the Reichs Fuehrer SS. I do not doubt, that the SD had its own representative in Shanghai, who was possibly even unknown to HUBER, but whose authority, if he cared to make himself known and exercise it, would automatically make him HUBER's superior.
