On March 13, 1957, T-2, who has furnished reliable information in the past, related one COESTAMTH GAVRILESCU contacted the Russman Legation, Machington, D.C., on that date. GAVRILESCU inquired concerning the availability of his passport. GAVRILESCU claimed he had contacted the Russman Legation approximately nine months previously from Venezuela. This individual stated he was without funds and had arrived in the United States at New York, by book several days previously.

T-3, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on key 6, 1957, he had heard of one CAVRILESCU being seen in New York, New York. It was rumored that CAVRILESCU was staying at a hotel in Brooklyn, New York, and had been a visitor at the Rumonian Orthodox Church of St. Dumitru which is located in Manhattan, New York.

T-4, who has furnished reliable information in the past, was contacted on March 18 and 22, 1957. On those occasions, the source had no information pertaining to GAVRILESCU.

On May 9, 1957, T-4 advised it had some to his attention that one of the young men of the Russnian Colony in New York, New York, was rith a friend in Times Square a few days before Sunday, March 24, 1957. They were speaking Russnian to each other and were overheard by a stranger who introduced himself as GAYRILESOU, in Russnian. After some social conversation, the three them went to a local motion picture theatre.

In addition, T-4 advised a personal friend, who had been at sea, returned for a short visit to New York.
T-4 inquired of this party regarding GAVRILISGU. The friend furnished the following information to the source which may be possibly identical:

He is believed to have recided in Germany for a time and, thereafter, to have travelled to South America where he has resided for the past few years.
