HUMMEL, J.C.

SPAIN
Barcelona

A German soldier, about 43, medium build, brown hair, grey eyes, good appearance, wore uniform. Speaks English, French and Danish, as well as Spanish. His Danish wife lives in Denmark. Formerly a medical orderly in the German Field Army, later with Abwehrtrupp 263. Crossed from France into Spain in civilian clothes on 6/19/44. Known to be living with relative in Barcelona in Sept. 1944, Heinrich Sewab at Ticiano 14. He became ill in Spain and source believes that he is war weary and for this reason may have gone sick. Is not friendly towards Third Reich and cannot be regarded as a menace to Anglo-American interests in Spain, according to source.
