Operations Memorandum No. 1

- 1. Reference is made to paragraph 7, Changes 2 to CIG Administrative Order No. 6, dated 12 August 1946.
- 2. All CIG liaison contacts with other agencies of the Covernment will be made initially by ICAPS.
- 3. Liaison requirements of other activities of the CIG will be referred to ICAPS for action.
- h. At such time as appropriate plans and policies are developed certain direct limison functions may be delegated to other CIG activities. In such cases, rigid adherence to established policies will be required, and copies of all direct correspondence in connection with authorised direct limison will be sent to ICAPS. This will not include the normal exchange of information and intelligence data.
- 5. The Executive for Personnel and Administration will insure that no lisison matters are cleared to other Covernment agencies without reference to ICAPS, except these matters specifically covered by separate written authority under paragraph & above.



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REMARKS: SUBJECT: Established of Substron

- 1. It is recommended that a suitable CIG policy be developed and published to regulate the establishment of liaison between operating offices of CIG and the departments and agencies with which they will deal. The policy should be distributed for the information of the departments and agencies as well as for internal information of CIG. It should list, for the information of the departments and agencies, the names and principal functions of CIG offices which may from time to time initiate liaison.
- 2. In view of the large volume of lisison that will be necessary, it is desirable that authority to initiate diaison be vested in Chiefs at least as far down as Branch Chiefs subordinate to Assistant Directors. Once such a Branch Chief has initiated lisison with an office in a department or agency, he should thereafter be empowered to authorise his own subordinates to continue the lisison, subject to his supervision.
- 3. Development and coordination of the above appears to properly fall within the functions of ICAPS and is therefore submitted for consideration.
