(b)(3)	(U//AIUO) From the Archives: CIA Monitors 1952 Rumor that USSR Plans To Retake Alaska from US (U//AIUO) The USSR would retake forcibly, if necessary Alaska from the US in 1955, according to a CIA information report dated 1952 that was recently reviewed by the DO team at the CIA Declassification Center. The report outlined a rumor that was circulating around the USSR that the US had leased, not purchased, Alaska from Russia in 1867, and the lease was to expire in 1955, at which time the Soviet Government would demand Alaska's return. According to the rumor, if the US did not accede, the USSR would recover Alaska by force.	(b)(

(b)(3)(b)(5)(U//AIUO) Requester Seeks Copy of Saddam Hussein's Romance Novel (U//ATUO) A requester from Dallas asked for "records on, and if available, a translation of, the novel Zabibah and the King, which was supposedly penned by Saddam Hussein." (b)(5)The romance novel was reported by The New York Times in an article dated 25 May 2001 titled "CIA Sleuths Study a Novel for the Thinking of Hussein," in which the Times reported that the CIA believes Saddam Hussein "probably did not write (the romance novel), but that he carefully supervised its production and suffused it with his own words and ideas." (U//AIUO) Democrats Interested in Information on Representative Graham (U//AIUO) The Deputy Research Director of the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee asked for "correspondence and other information requested by or provided to [Representative] Lindsey Graham (R-SC) between January 1, 1995 to the present." (b)(3) (b)(5)(U//ALLO) National Security Archive Requests Information on Peruvian Elections (U//AFGO) The National Security Archive requested information on the presidential elections held in Peru in 2000, "including any US monitoring of the elections and allegations of fraud; allegations (in March 2000) of systematic forgery of qualifying signatures for Alberto Fujimori's 'Peru 2000' party; April 9, 2000 first round elections; [the] withdrawal of second round run-off candidate Alejandro Toledo from the May 2000 Peruvian elections after his calls for a postponement of the elections were refused; [and the] May 28, 2000 runoff elections."
