Darling to the Agency's Legislative Council, which was recently reviewed for declassification by the DCI Team at the OIM Declassification Center, the historian outlined the origins of the DCI's responsibility to protect sources and methods. "So far as we can tell, the formula with respect to the Director's responsibility to protect intelligence sources and methods originated in a meeting of the Joint Strategic Survey Committee of the Joint Chiefs of Staff on January 18, 1945. They were discussing the memorandum from Donovan to the President of November 18, 1944 and the plan for a central intelligence organization which came out of the historic 121st meeting of the Joint Intelligence Committee on Friday, December 22, 1944."
