As an active Ustasha participated in the Ustashi revolution in Zagreb (1941). Appointed secretary of the Croat Embassy in Rome. Seen frequently with German officials in Rome during the occupation.</p> <p>After the Armistice he remained in Rome working for PWB until his dismissal. He is allegedly working as an agent for the French or for the Russians, but definitely not for the British or American.</p> <p>Has plenty of funds at his disposal. A weak and venal character who would work for the highest bidder.</p> <p>Contacts: MARCUS, his chief agent(perhaps identical with a Dr. MACUS mentioned in S.I.L.O. report BY/P/28, 30 October 1944).
