Evaluation: Believed reliable. Refer to X-2 reports Nos. 4 and 5 from same source. (C-2)

Summary: Transcription of stenographers notes based upon interrogation conducted along lines of a questionnaire prepared by X-2 and X-B.

This document reveals much of the central organization of the Abwehr and personalities connected with it. It also contains material on German organization in the Balkans and the various Abwehrstellen operating against Turkey and the Middle East.

Supplementary questions reveal the structure of other Axis intelligence systems operating in Turkey against the Middle East and also how much is known of Allied Intelligence Systems operating in Turkey.

Action: Forwarded for the use of X-2 for such distribution to American agencies as may be desired. Inasmuch as the interrogation was a joint operation, the same material has been forwarded independently for British distribution.

1. APWEHRAMT

1) There are three main sections, I, II and III, which are divided into sub-sections such as I Marine, I Heer, III C, III F etc.

ii) ABWEHR I

The centre of this organization is the O.K.W. in Berlin, the outposts being called Abwehrstellen, Abwehrleitstellen and Abwehrrnebenstellen according to their degree of importance. Abwehrstellen work only inside the Reich, in other countries they are known as K.O.s (Kriegsorganisationen). These K.O.s do not work against the country in which they are centred, and send out their agents independently of Abwehrstellen and also of Berlin. For instance, here in Turkey, LEVERKÜHN has his organization and depends direct on Berlin, but Sofia also send their agents to Turkey, who will not be known to LEVERKÜHN.

iii) ABWEHR II

This section deals with sabotage, revolutions, subversive propaganda etc., and collaborates very closely with the Sicherheitsdienst.

The Frankenburg Lehrregiment in Berlin is the training centre for Abwehr II men, though there are also a few Abwehr III men in it.

This section is more interested in IRAN and IRAQ but after the MAYER affair source does not see that they can do very much. The general idea seems to be to cut off communications and transport lines between the Persian Gulf and Russia. They are not interested in PALESTINE and SYRIA and only in EGYPT as the probable base for ITALY in the event of an Allied offensive in the Balkans. This section appears to expect the Allies to cut off Greece and the Dodecanese and leave them alone to concentrate on the Balkans; they are facing the possibility of success, particularly after the breakdown of the Bulgarian Army in January.

The German Army has more or less taken over this section's work in the Caucasus. Abwehr II was very interested in this sphere about a year ago.

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(iv) ABWEHR III

Was first housed in the main building in the Tierpitz Ufer and then in the Prinz Heinrich Strasse, Berlin. It is now believed to be in ZEPPELIN near Mark Brandenburg. Its link in Berlin is in the Friedenverkehrshaus in the Potsdamer Strasse about 100 yards from the Potsdamerbrücke towards Potsdamer Platz.

- a) Leiter of Abwehr III is Oberst BOHLER alias MOEDLER. He is a good Security man, broad-minded, a Prussian officer of the old school, a gentleman, cannot be bribed. Deputyleiter (see 6X-109)
- b) Oberst Lt. FREUND Milo alias FLUX alias MIDO. He comes from Frankfurt, is not a Prussian but has all the qualities of the Parvazns; his sole aim is to make a career for himself, and for this became a Nazi, not through conviction. He likes to live well, is clever, in some ways is very childish. He is not honest, not a gentleman, is a kind of blackmailer of his own people, he could be bribed. He is fond of drink, is extremely ambitious, and source does not think anything satisfactory could be done with him.
- c) FREUND's assistant is Hauptmann SCHREIDER. He is not a good Security man, is an ardent Catholic from Cologne. He is a good German, very honest, idealistic. Source believes that if he could be convinced and stirred in his dislike for the Nazi regime he might be of use. Does Abwehr III work because it is a duty. He and FREUND deal with the South Eastern part. Source does not know who deals with the South West. He states there are no other officers in this section.

(v)

III F

Deals with foreign and enemy intelligence services, plain Contre-espionage and deception.

III C

Internal Contre-espionage. Each Army unit has a III C officer who is a regular Army officer and not distinguishable from the others in any way.

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The G.F.P. is the executive for III C. There is a III C representative at every Abwehrstelle and they run their own agents. Outside the Reich, however, III C work is done either by the G.F.P. or, as in the case of Turkey, through the Sicherheitsdienst or the Gestapo.

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2. AST VIENNA

- i) Responsible for all the Balkans, Turkey, Poland,
- ii) Russia, and the South East.

iii) Graf MAROGHA-REDWITZ

He has the rank of Oberst. He is a very good Abwehr officer, a gentleman, very much liked, is fair in his dealings with his men. He is Austrian, not a Nazi and tries to employ Austrians who are not Nazis; Catholic, a great sense of duty, a strong character and will risk everything for his convictions. tall, grey hair, vigorous face, good looking and very well dressed. His address is in the telephone directory.

SCHENKER-ANGEBER is one of his protégés and owes his position to him.

- iv) 1 Luft is engineer HAGNER alias WERS.

3. BAKAN ABWEHRSTELLEN

Other Balkan Abwehrstellen known to source are Sofia, Bucharest, Budapest, Belgrade, Zagreb, Athens.

- i) Under SOPIA are the following Nebenstellen: Varna, Burgas, Plivdiv, Stara Zagora, Russe, Kavalla, Deleagotchi, Skoplje, Manjaca, Jambol.

- a) At KAVALLA is ORLADEM. He was in Turkey in June, is from the Navy Department. There was something wrong with the courier service and ORLADEM quarrelled over it with YEN MARWITZ and sent ORLADEM to investigate. He is anti Nazi but would never come over to the Allies.

- b) At RUSSE there is one representative at the Consulate.

- c) At DELEAGOTCHI are representatives of the G.F.P. and also a Sicherheitsdienst man. Between DELEAGOTCHI and IVILICHAD POLFINGER is the Sicherheitsdienst representative.

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d) At JAMBOL they handle everything they can't cope with at Burgas. The representative there is Alfons LUDWIG, tobacco merchant. In his house he receives all people of importance who come and he knows everything. His house is also the centre of the Abwehr III for the district. He is Swedish, has a very good position in Bulgaria, is independent. He is about 52 years of age. In return for his services to the Abwehr, DELIUS arranged the transfer to Germany of all his fortune and intervenes when he has trouble with the Bulgarian Government on account of his large business and money transactions. He is most useful as he has so many contacts and is in a position to recommend persons to work for Delius. He is not a Nazi though he was a member of the Party to help his business. He quarrels continuously with the Chiefs of the Party. His wife, Dolli, aged 35, was a dancer; in July they left for Germany to settle there, but returned in November, having had enough. Source believes that if approached in an honest way and convinced, Dolli would help us, and her husband would be able to give us a wealth of information. But they must be convinced.

- e) In SOPIA the III F representative is Major Dr. MAHER alias EBIAN. All services have moved from Sofia to TSAMKORIA about 60 kms out in the mountains. There is only a switchboard operator left in Sofia.
- f) Connected with the German services in SOPIA is Gustav SCHLIDER - see Page 9 para 5 (iii)
- g) In Istanbul the administrative work for SOPIA goes through Thomas LUDWIG not LEVERKORN. The material is passed through LUDWIG's own courier and he looks after the agents.
- h) A great deal of Abwehr work is done under cover of the PETKI organization, in Sofia.

(ii) Nebenstellen under BUCHAREST are as follows: Brasov, Csarnowitz, Constanza, Galatz, Timisoara, Giurgiu. There is at least one representative in every largish town.

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is BUCHARESCU the representative of III F
as Sonderführer PETERSMAN. He came in December
1941 but source is not certain whether he is still
there. He is a professor and looks a trifle stupid.
he succeeded Oberst Lt. BOHNSCHIED.

(iii) in BUDAPEST the III F representative is
PFANNENSTIEL who is also the K.O. Leiter. He
was previously in MÜNICH.

(iv) in LAGOS the K.O. Leiter is REWESCH alias
BUSCH. He is I Luft.

4. (1) LEVERKÜHN

Source is sure that this is not a cover name.
He is ambitious to the point of madness, very
intelligent, civilized, well educated, is a
gentleman, very interested in U.S.A.

Being very ambitious and a born politician he
wants to play a big part in politics. He and Von
PAPPE have the same views and LEVERKÜHN has a
great admiration for him. He is continually
quarrelling with the O.K.W. who forbids him his
political activity, but Von PAPPE supports him in
this respect. His one aim is to help Germany out
of her terrible situation.

He would like an agreement to be reached between
Germany and U.S.A. to get the United States out of
the war in Europe and then Britain would have to
give in. For months he studies internal developments
in America and is very well informed.]

Von PAPPE and LEVERKÜHN began to work on
their American policy; they needed some support
as Von PAPPE depends solely on HITLER, and they
found that HITLER was interested in their idea
for selfish reasons, for, an Agreement with America
meaning the only possibility for a compromised Peace,
it is clear that this can only be concluded without
HITLER and LEVERKÜHN is the only man who could
take his place. Once the situation was so tense
that the possibility had to be considered of a coup
d'Etat by HITLER who holds all the cards, the
help of the S.S., he is Minister of the Interior,
and he is the only one of whom nothing can be said

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against his moral reputation. He has the false reputation of being a clever Statesman, and if he replaced HITLER now he would have the support of the majority of the Germans.

Meetings were arranged; VON PAPPEN talked with him in Summer 1943, then LEVERKÜHN went to Germany in the same summer and met him, and again in November and came back impressed with HITLER's cleverness and political views, saying that he supported their American policy. He must even have talked it over with HITLER for when VON PAPPEN saw HITLER recently he approved of the policy. However, they see that HITLER's position is insecure and want to remain on good terms with HITLER.

a) A personal friend of LEVERKÜHN is a certain MOHN. He is an officer in the German Army and was sent to Istanbul on Abwehr work under cover of being a merchant. Now he has worked up such a successful business that he would like to war to go on for a long time. He has good links with the top personalities of the S.D. in Berlin, and it was he who arranged the meetings between HITLER and LEVERKÜHN.

b) BILL DUNOVAN is a personal friend of LEVERKÜHN who said he would be delighted to talk to him if ever he should come to Turkey. Source believes that if he could be convinced that every day more he works for Germany now will lessen the prospects of the Peace for which he is striving, he would be honest enough to admit that he is wrong and might act accordingly. He should be told that America will never come to an agreement with Germany unless there is unconditional surrender, and he will admit how hopeless Germany's position is and might possibly move. Bill would have to be convinced.

c) LEVERKÜHN's assistant is VON KORNHORN who does the purely Abwehr work for him. KORNHORN

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is extremely suspicious and would like to
oust LAZARUS and take his place. via
some person who returned to Germany he sent
an adverse criticism about LAZARUS using
snogrt ather things, the PERMANENT
incident.

6) LAZARUS is in direct contact with
the Turkish Secret Service through Kasim
AKER. He also has contact with JIN and
certainly knows that SHAD SAUER is one of
JIN's son.

11) I M was in WILSON
SCHEIN-ARNDT has for assistant and W/2 operator
a man called King - surname unknown.

111) Thomas LOUIS alias LOUIS alias LOUIS

He is not very intelligent but has good common
sense. is diligent, professional, very suspicious,
unscrupulous, charming to a person's face but would
not hesitate to play tricks.

He lives at Waltham with his secretary,
Maria MARINS alias LOUIS. Before the war she
lived for two years in London and is believed to
keep in touch with her friends there. She was in
Belgium with LOUIS, and is completely controlled
and closely watched by him.

a) LOUIS meets his contacts in great
secrecy. He is on the ground floor of the
house in the garden of the German Consulate.
To see his secretary's bell at the door, a
girl will look from behind a window and if
she knows you will let you in then you go
to another door and a bell rings in LOUIS's
room which is always locked. His other
secretary comes out to report you. you
knock at his door in a special way and can
then enter. You leave the building by
another door or that way of his contacts
over next apartment. If you have to wait
you are shown into a waiting room and the
door is locked.

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b) Source learned by chance that one of his informers is a certain FRANK RD whose wife is one of EDWIG's secretaries. He put EDWIG in touch with FRANK RD (see file) who also keeps all his outside contacts for him.

2) Source believes EDWIG has planted an agent on MARTINSON as none of visit to his house, and visitors to the station and dead-end reached are known to him very soon afterwards.

(11) AMER GRAND. American, was a German prisoner. Sometimes comes to Turkey. He has two speaking in B.G.A. and two friends in concentration camp in Germany.

(111) AMERICAN AMER. American, very plain man. He lived like the subject, made a fortune in Bulgaria and is one of the most important men working for Germany. For business reasons he had to join the Red Army, but is a well-known specialist. He is supposed to be having financial and political connections with the German and Italian governments, and is supposed to be in contact with the German and Italian governments. 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Additional Information Requested by U.S.

VIETNAM

This is not his real name, but his Arpan name. Works under BLANIER of Vietnam, and reported about Russia, probably via YANIKORIN, who was working under Japanese orders as contact between them and the Soviets.

(1) Hobila Amehyr Frumys are military units under the G.I.P. They work in close touch with some AGX and are employed in areas where guerrillas operate.

JAPANESE I.S. in Middle East (addendum to reports on hand)

The Japanese are interested that the war should continue in Europe as long as possible. They don't now a German defeat but want to support Russian activities in Eastern Europe and the Balkans up to the Danube-River in order to keepen existing differences between the British and Russians and so the German British forces in the Mediterranean and Balkans as a guard against Russia.

There are many indications that the Japanese have contact with the Soviets, through what the Germans have noted "Geopeter Rudrichenski" was:

(1) Poloni through all his Russian contacts in Ankara. (2) Toni was in Sofia with summer 1943 and even tried to get the Germans' official permission to have contact with the Russians; this was not granted but he had unofficial contact. Now he works himself in his own flat; one of the

visitors to his flat was also seen at the Russian Consulate; and some of his contacts was alleged to be with the Russians but have dealings with the Germans. He is his job for deal with Soviet Russia. Now he has also organized a full Balkan Service and gets news regularly from there.

The Japanese plan to give the Russians Balkan material in return for which they hope to get Allied information.

(133) That the new Russian Military Attache arrived in Istanbul had a long talk with Yakov M. G. ... and when the Japanese Intelligence received from Berlin they advised the Russians and were very much surprised to see how much they knew about the East front.

- (iv) Contacts were established between the Japanese and the FASE agency.
- (v) UREDA in SOPIA has a widespread Polish organization reaching far into Poland; this organization is also working from Budapest and Bucharest and he passed on such information as he received to the Russians through LEUMI who gave it to the at Consul in Sofia. The Germans arrested some of the Polish collaborators of UREDA.
- (vi) YELIOTHI worked under Japanese orders as their Soviet link, giving European material to the Russians.
- (vii) In KEIRUI there is an Iranian who sends them reports through the Iranian couriers; they are only interested in roads, railways and oil production in Iran and Iraq, also in shipping down the Persian Gulf. KOVICS used to handle this second question but when he was turned out and his service crumbled, they got another Hungarian to continue this line.

III HUNGARIAN I.S. in the MIDDLE EAST

- (i) Otto WITZ in Istanbul, Military Attache. He has an English mother and is alleged to be pro-Allied, and it was said that on this account he was almost not allowed to come here; source finds this very difficult to believe; he used to work for the Abwehr, went to Sofia and worked probably both with HELMER and ANT VIERNA. He is honest in that he works purely in the interests of Hungary, and cannot be bribed.
- (ii) The Press Attache, LANDER was bought by WOLF of the Sicherheitsdienst. LINDER
- (iii) The Consul General, BISSEKOFF, is pro-American.
- (iv) Regarding military intelligence, they are only interested in Turkey and Thrace, having no money for more.

IV HUNGARIAN I.S. in MIDDLE EAST

A certain ROST comes to Istanbul. He is president of the Foreign Correspondents' Union in Sofia and is also correspondent of some German papers. He was once a Communist but is now an extremist on the other side. He

is working for the Abwehr as a provocateur and plants fake material on Americans and Englishmen. He once gave fake material to an American or English agent in Istanbul and took to Sofia questions received by that man which he showed to the Military Attache and brought back the answers.

V ROMANIAN I.S. in MIDDLE EAST

- (i) URLIATIANU is double crossing his own people. He is in the service of WOLF. He belongs to the LITTMANN crowd. LITTMANN is a Romanian Jew, proprietor of the "Sinal Express" (?) and has an English passport. He was given fake material by URLIATIANU but is convinced he is all right. At the end of November URLIATIANU left Istanbul saying he had been called back to Bucharest; he went to Sofia and claims to have visited Varna and Salonika. He said the English distrust him. Source, whom he denounced a month ago, is convinced anything he may have given us will be planted.
- (ii) FRONZI, intelligence service, has contact with the American Military Attache.
- (iii) ORNA said to be in touch with Archie Gibson.
- (iv) Colonel SPODORESCU, military attache. It is confirmed that a fortnight ago he gave to the English some material he had received from Colonel TANALIC.

VI The Germans know very little about the American intelligence organization.

VII The Germans have lists of names and telephone numbers in the British Embassy, but these lists convey nothing to them.

By bribing someone in the post office, the Germans got copies of British ciphered and enciphered telegrams sent through the Turkish post; this began about the end of 1942 and lasted a few months. Then a story went round that the Japanese in LISBON, particularly SATO, was mixed up in some business about stolen American code books. LOMO then wrote to Berlin asking about the "GOLBE Album" which had arrived in Lisbon, and the Japanese asked the Germans for the ciphered telegrams which were then sent to Berlin. Source is absolutely certain that no Allied code is in possession of the Germans.

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VIII The Abwehr have practically no knowledge of Soviet intelligence services. They know about Russian contacts with the Japanese and have from the Turkish police and intelligence hundreds of names of Soviet men whom they have no particulars.

IX G.I.S. Relations with Turkish I.S.

- (i) LEVERKORN has direct contact through Kasal ACORN. The liaison from the Turkish side to the Germans was SHAD SAKIR via MASTOROFF. SUAK SAKIR is known to LEVERKORN as one of JIKAL's men.
- (ii) VELIKOVSKI had a Russian friend who used to be a translator for JIKAL; JIKAL soon found this out and dismissed him.
- (iii) The Japanese employ a certain SHAMLI, proprietor of an Armenian weekly; he is, however, also an agent of the Turks. He is mixed up with an Armenian crowd in the Middle East, in which a lady singer is involved who is in touch with the British and is sometimes invited to the British Embassy to give performances there. He gave away EROMOTO and DEK and the Japanese are now beginning to suspect him; he is always reporting in Ankara.
- (iv) This group of Armenians seems to be in touch with the Russians because they never get any Russian material. A story went round that Hamak ARSLANYAN, Communist sympathiser, arranged with the TASHAK organisation that they should never work against Russia, and when the Japanese tried to use this organisation in the Russian-occupied zone of Iran, it failed.
- (v) KALA, very pleasant man, speaks Japanese, always in touch with AKKI in Ankara; very pro American and might possibly be used against the Japanese.

X Germans with knowledge of technical developments of

German Patrons

- (i) RIKOWSKI, manager of Seaparit
- (ii) HEINRICH, friend of REPL and RAUSCHER who would also both be useful. He is officially a merchant but is a I S man, Sadeta German, wife Tyrolean.
- (iii) STURMANN, tobacco merchant, has very good contacts.
- (iv) WENIGER, East, native of Istanbul, friend of

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SCHNEIDER-INGENIER, merchant, representative of various firms. He personally might not have knowledge specially about weapons etc, but he is in touch with all industrialists coming from Germany. Would not openly come over to Allies, but could tell us a great deal if properly approached.

- (v) MESSNER, Viennese, left Istanbul a week ago. He is a great rubber man, one of the twelve men forming Hitler's Economic Advisory Committee.
- (vi) LECHNER, very strong character, not a Nazi, friend of WEIDMANN - see below - He has a very good reputation and could be of use to us through his contacts.
- (vii) WEIDMANN, manager of the Deutsche Bank. He is also assistant Military Attaché but purely in order to get a diplomatic passport. He is trying to get a Swiss passport for himself and his wife, and has also bought a villa in Geneva; has excellent contacts.

- (vii) Professor EINHORN, sculptor, very weak, absolutely independent; his wife and children and income are in Turkey. He suffers a lot on account of his first marriage with a Jewess, for he has a son who is half-Jew. It would be of no military value for him to come over to us, but great propaganda, for he is a friend of Yon PAFF and was originally sent to Turkey as German propaganda. He knows the U.S.A. well.
