ANDO, Yoichi (No Telecode)

Born: 9/29/18. Subject arrived by air, Bromse, Sweden (9/11/44). Was Third Secretary in Japanese Legation, Portugal; Japanese Legation wrote to Dietmar at the German Legation, Lisbon, stating that they were sending Subject's passport, No. 015,116, destination Sweden, and that Subject will leave as normal Diplomatic courier. (8/24/44) Passport No. -#15116 - issued Lisbon, 10/6/43; #015,116 - Sweden, issued Lisbon. (9/6/44)

SAKAWA, Ginnaburo (No Telecode)

Secretary of Japanese Legation in Stockholm.

NUMA, Jiro (No Telecode)

Address: Vartavagen 21, 2 tr., Stockholm, Sweden. (Tel. 62-23-38) Born: c. 3/4/06, Tokyo, Japan, slim, dark, even features; long typically Japanese face, wears spectacles. Speaks and writes fluent English, little German. Subject is intelligent, fairly social; is pro-German. Is a University graduate. Reported to be contact with FIRM BLUMBERG-ROTSCHILD of 80 Broad Street, New York City, Ship Brokers & Agents. Subject receives 2,000 kr. monthly for living expenses and 2,000 kr. representing magazine. Chief of Intelligence Office. (4/18/43). Secretary to Japanese Military Attache and with INOUE directs Japanese Intelligence Service. (2/43). Interested in naval and air information. Officially he is Secretary to Japanese Military Attache in Sweden. Actually, his activities have an espionage character and he works along this line independently of his official duties. Subject is in close contact with the German Intelligence Service in Sweden. On the outside, he emphasizes his personal contacts with the Swedes. During 1939-40 Subject travelled in the United States, Spain, Italy, France, Germany, and Great Britain; he is looking for contacts in Great Britain and the United States. Very active and constantly visiting Germans and Hungarians.

INOUE, Joichi (Yoichi) (No Telecode)
(also spelled: INOUE, Yoichi)
(Cover name: ILLAR)

Born: 2/11/12. Secretary to Japanese Military Attache. (2/43). Subject earns 1200 Kr. per month. Formerly employed by Japanese firm KITSUBIEMI in Berlin. Concerned mostly with Economic Information. Subject associated with NUMA. Subject in contact with HORN; in this contact Subject uses cover name, ILLAR. Japanese postbox c/o Herr INOUE, Lutzengatan 9, 4th floor, mail address to Herr MAO IMTOSH.

KITAHARA, Hiroshi (Dr.)
(also spelled: KITAHARA-RASHU) (No. 100000000)

Address: Furusundegatan 7, Stockholm, Sweden. (10/43) Born: 11/21/09, Tokyo. Wears glasses; speaks German, Italian and English. Subject held scholarship at Geneva and has written books in German on economic subjects. He has ample means - the figure given by one source for his annual income is 14,400 Swiss francs. In 1941 he held a post in Japanese Legation in Rome, where he exercised considerable influence. In 1942 probably visited Lisbon. In Stockholm he has made his home in the flat formerly occupied by URESHINO; his beautiful Italian wife and their child, aged about one, are with him. MATSUI, one of the heads of Japanese Intelligence in Madrid had Subject's name and address noted in his diary. Subject also Intelligence Officer, Japanese Journalist for YUJIKU in Stockholm, replaced HANES URESHINO. Subject's father is owner of ASAHI (Tokyo newspaper). (2/21/44)

KODA, Jotaro (No. 100000000)

Address: Villagatan 3 B, 3 tr., Stockholm, Sweden. Born: 7/22/26. First Secretary at Japanese Legation; also Charge d' affaires before arrival of Minister OKAMOTO (8/21/43). Subject guest of honor at dinner given by Dr. Rutger ESSEN, celebrating founding of new Sweden-Nazi Party.

KURAKI, Tutomu (No. 100000000)

Born: 6/25/12. Subject is diplomatic courier. (9/5/44) Formerly professor at Finland University, Helsinki.

MAKIMURA, Kiyoshi

Address: Tjarnhovagatan 3, Stockholm, Sweden. Secretary in Japanese Legation, Stockholm. (2/43) Subject suspected of intelligence activities.

MATSUBATA, Shojo

Address: c/o T. RASSELQUIST, Linnegatan 42, Stockholm, Sweden. Secretary in Japanese Legation in Stockholm (2/43). Possibly Intelligence Officer. SHOKIN, Tokyo, ordered SHOKIN, Berlin, to credit Subject at Japanese Legation, Stockholm with 1,170 Yen.

MISHINA, Iori (No. 100000000)

Born: 12/22/05. Subject in Paris until June 1942. Japanese Naval Attaché in Stockholm. (Nov. 1943) Appointed May 1942; arrived September. Replaced Japanese-speaking Secretary, FROKEN JUNO, with FRANK BOND, formerly employed by General Kotors, Sweden, probably to obtain new sources of information as Subject not known to have any Swedish contacts. SHOKIN, Tokyo, ordered SHOKIN, Berlin, to pay Subject 1,000 Yen through Swiss Bank, Geneva.

NAKASHITA, E.
(also spelled: NAKASHIBA, Kaoru)

SHOKIN, Tokyo ordered SHOKIN, Berlin to pay Subject at Japanese Legation, Helsinki, 1,774.80 Yen. Arrived in Sweden 3/24/44.

OKAMOTO, Suenaga Hidemasa

Born: 1892, Kyoto-fu. Graduated from Tokyo Imperial University with a degree in Politics in 1917. Entered Foreign Service. Served End Section Commercial Bureau, 1917; delegate to Peace Conference, 1923. First Section European-American Bureau of Foreign Office, 1928; Third Secretary Washington Embassy, 1928; Consul at Seattle in 1928. Chief Section European and American Bureau 1931. Chief Account Secretary, Foreign Ministry Secretariate, 1934. Consul General to Shanghai and Counselor of the Embassy in China, 1937; Counselor at Embassy in London, 1938; Consul General to Singapore, sometime between 1937 and 1942. Subject is believed to have been, prior to Pearl Harbor, always very pro-American and opposed to Japanese military program. Was one of the more honest, reliable and frank of the Japanese diplomats. SHOKIN, Tokyo ordered SHOKIN, Berlin to credit Subject at Japanese Legation with 87,800 Yen. Counselor in London until recalled, May 1940. Subject suspected of intelligence activities. (9/5/44)

ONODERA, Makoto
(Also spelled: ONUDERA, Makoto)

Born: 9/19/87. Formerly a lecturer in the Japanese Military Academy and then Military Attache to the German countries. Has never done front line service. No special professional aptitude, but cunning and artful. Subject is in close connection with German Intelligence Service in Sweden; frequently visits Berlin, Budapest, Bucharest, and Finland. Has relations with Estonian and Latvian diplomats. Subject and General von UTHMANN went to Oslo about October 1st, 1944, and both returned to Stockholm, October 4, 1944. Subject is dominating figure in joint organization between German and Japanese Intelligence. One report says that WAGNER has failed and Germans will work with Japanese whom they believe have strong hold in Sweden. This will also function after cessation of hostilities and will be worked through Finland. Lt. HORN, formerly with Cellarius, is in constant touch with Subject. (11/4/44)

SAITO, Masami

Born: 10/30/11. Receives money through Takeo UENO, Japanese Legation Attache in Madrid: (5/17/43) Subject believed to be diplomatic personnel, Madrid. (5/17/43)

SAITO, Masutosi

Born: 5/17/13. Japanese Attache in Stockholm.

SATO, Kichinosuke
(Also spelled: SATO, Kitiinosuke)

Born: 3/3/03. Holds Diplomatic passport #016317. (2/43). Journalist for T.S.B. Subject is an authority on the United States. Reported to know America and Germany very well. Intelligence Officer paid by HQMA (8/26/44).

SATO, Tatsu

Born: 10/2/03. Good English, smattering of German. Subject arrived in Stockholm towards end of 1943; was previously in Italy and also spent two years in United Kingdom before outbreak of war. Now works in Military Attache's Room in Stockholm; apparatus for reproduction of photographs, a copying machine and a duplicator have been provided for his use, while a bathroom has been converted into a laboratory. (3/21/44)

SUZAKE, Haruo

(Also spelled: SUZAKI, Haruo)

Subject arrived in Stockholm 6/28/42; lives with his wife Kazuko. Was in Paris until June 1942; studied painting there for 13 years.

SUJITA, Tsunekichi

Air traveller to Berlin. (6/15/44)

TAKENOCHI, Goichi

Attache in Japanese Legation. (5/27/44)

TSUCHIYA, Jun

Born: 7/22/02. Diplomat, Sweden. (6/20/44). Spent 3 days at Japanese Legation, Bern, on 3/3/44; entered via the German-Swiss border. Air traveller to Berlin, 3/1/44.

URIU, Katsuo

Born: 2/13/13. Secretary in Japanese Legation in Stockholm. (1/44)

YAMAGUCHI, Takaji (Ryuji)

(Also spelled: YAMAGUCHI, Ryuji)

Address: c/o Maria FRIBERG, Hempension, Karlavagen 57, Stockholm. SHOKIN, Tokyo ordered SHOKIN, Berlin, to credit subject at Japanese Legation, Stockholm, with 1,165 Yen (6/9/44). Assistant Naval Attache to Russia and Finland, 1940, Secretary Japanese Legation, Stockholm. (2/43) I.S. Officer. (2/43)

(also spelled: FUJI, Tadasi)

Born: 5/5/11; Japanese Recording Secretary at Legation; SHOKIN, Tokyo, ordered SHOKIN, Berlin, to pay Subject 1,055 Yen. Air traveller - arrived Sweden 8/13/44; air traveller - arrived Bromma 8/13/44.

HAGATA, Tyoasemon:

Born: 5/3/10; Japanese Military Attache Secretary in Helsinki; arrived by air, Bromma 9/14/44.

NAKASHIMA, K.
(also spelled: NAKASHIMA, Kazuo)

SHOKIN, Tokyo ordered SHOKIN, Berlin to pay Subject at Japanese Legation, Helsinki, 1,774.20 Yen. Arrived in Sweden 3/24/44.

SAKAYA, Tadashi
(also spelled: SAKAYA, Tamaki (Matsui))

Born: 2/1887; Minister to Finland. SHOKIN, Tokyo ordered SHOKIN, Berlin to credit his account with 78,229.50 Yen. Graduate Tokyo Imperial University, Law, 1914; interpreter of Army, 1914; Railway Commissioner Tsingtao Defense Army, 1917; apprentice-consul Hamburg, 1925; vice consul 1925; served 2nd section Commercial Bureau of Foreign Office, 1928; 2nd section Embassy Germany, 1933; 1st section Embassy, Germany; Chief of Archives Section, Foreign Office. Minister to Finland, September 1940. Protested vigorously to Foreign Office about an editorial which appeared in Erko's paper HELSINGIN SANOMAT (evidently criticizing Japanese treatment of war prisoners), and demanded that editorial be withdrawn and a statement from the Legation published.

YOKURA, Eiji

Connected with Japanese Legation, Helsinki. SHOKIN, Tokyo ordered SHOKIN, Berlin to credit Subject at Japanese Legation with two sums - one for 32,972.15 and the other 1,258 Yen.
