1. As para. A of reference states, OV C is retaining the services of Dill. Although we have not succeeded in breaking this association, we have obtained a OV G account, prepared by V-11961, of DAN's intelligence activities since the end of the wor. (His activities during the war are outlined in MNA-28917 of 30 April 1951.)

2. In the spring of 1947 DAH (then presumably in humich) was visited by the former Sonderfuehrer (fnu) PROEHLICH of Salaburg and non-com (fnu) COSILES. (Field Comment) we are asking 2IPPER for further identification. The number of persons named FROZHLICH who appear in POB files makes identification impossible. The likeliest possibility is a fam FROZHLICH who was dropped by ZIPPER is April 1949 for cooperating with the French IS. This FROEMICH was a member of sub-organization 102. The fru FROEMICH who appears in para. h of FDLA-5643 is another possibility. As for COMMING, a report of CIO Austria, dated 20 December 1946, lists a Phillips COMMING. Heutorstr. 12, Salsburg, us a sub-nource of an unidentified CIO source. Since this REFILES was also in touch with a Major Ind TURDEA, who in turn then headed a Rumanian intelligence group "of the Rumanian Army SSI of King Charles", and since EORDEA appears later in this report, it is probably safe to assume that the fnu GOELLES of this report and the Phillipp GUELLES of the CIC report are identical.) PROPHICH and COELLES were accompanied of the third man who gave his name as immunitarily and presented himself as an American captain. Two weeks later TATAR was succeeded by a first lieutenant in ROSKMERO. These persons invited DAN to work for the ALS, and he agreed. Shorely thereafter Lieutenant RCSEMPERO brought DAN to the Zeppelin Hotel in Stattgart, where he stayed for a time. This association was broken off

3. In the fall of 1947 DAN got in touch with Concrel DRO (true name: Drostomat Kaliayah of Kaliayah). Since Dan was no longer working for the group named above, he went to work for DRO. (Field Comment: As you know,

and DUHITRESCU were all part of the BREJER complex. See, for example, Project 100/5, including MDLA-1499, MDKM-3777, and MDKA-14297.) DAN worked with this group until the summer of 1948. He claims to have dropped out because the group failed to obtain any practical results.

- 4. In the auturn of 1947 DUMITRESCU also brought DAH together with an uncle of DUMITRESCU's wife. The uncle called himself FRITZ and lived in Salsburg. No IS cooperation developed from this secting.
- 5. Insofar as Dill knows, all of his associates were working for the Americans. LUMITRESCU was dropped on 1 July 1948 because he wanted too much money; he was then living in Karlsruhe at Hebelstrasse 17. Since then, according to DAN, he has started working for the CE section of the French IS. As old acquaintances, DAN and DUMITRESCU still meet upon occasion; but DAH vigorously denies that either discusses intelligence. Recently DAN has mentioned the former Rusanian major Vasile WATIU, who also calls himself Basil RATIU (no record of either name at POB). RATIU belongs to the "Chronique Hilitaire" faction which brings out, in Paris, the Russmian emigrant newspaper La Nation Roumaine. PATIU is also a member of the National Peasants' Party and is a close friend of Augustin POPA who plays a leading role in this party. RATTU first visited DAW about two years ago, and several nonths thereafter FATIU again visited DAN. On the occasion of the second visit the discussion concerned only stipends for students. During the first contact, however, RATIU had hinted that he would like to recruit DAN for IS work. Thereafter, however, DAN had heard a runor that RATIU, who stays in Frankfurt such of the time, is working for the British IS. Prom August 1944 until 1948 RATTU was the Rumanian military attache in Ankara; thereafter he emigrated to Paris. In Munich he now has a postal address: Excelsior Hotel, Room 130, Press Center. DAH has never worked for or with RATIV.
- 6. DAH undoubtedly has a large number of far-flung ties within Rumanian circles. It is thoroughly possible that he appears as a source or contact on one Allied list or another without himself being aware of such a listing. The nature of the association between DAH and V-11961 has led the latter, however, to the firm conclusion that DAH has told the full and true store in the above account and that he has no other present ties except to CV C.
