MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILE

Subject: [] (MI-6)

On 7 March subject came to the writer's office; the principal reason for the call was that Chief, Near East Division through [] had asked to see subject.

[] had two topics to discuss with subject:

- (1) See attached memo concerning CIA relations with the TASHIRAK Party (Armenians). On this subject will advise his headquarters;
- (2) [] stated CIA and the British Secret Service (MI-6) have certain limited liaison [] presently and make occasional trips to Fayid and/or Ismailia. Discussions were held some months ago with [] Chief, Middle East Division, MI-6, on the possibility of establishing liaison at Ismailia; but to date no arrangement had been made for having an American (CIA officer) stationed there. [] said this failure to send a CIA representative was due to inability to arrange cover and to CIA's shortage of personnel. He asked subject if he could determine [] present thinking on this problem, and on the possibility that MI-6 would move its headquarters from Ismailia or Fayid.

Subject said:

- (A) MI-6 would stay with the military headquarters and the British do not plan to leave the Suez until and unless a four-power command is established at which point British headquarters might be removed to, say, Cyprus or even to Cairo;
- (B) No CIA officer would be allowed to be assigned to (in) the MI-6 office at Ismailia or Fayid. No said cover arrangements would be most difficult as there was only a desert and the two places (Ismailia and Fayid) and the Suez Development Corporation was the only firm in the area.

Subject promised to send London a cable on this question, however.


