1. KAUSCH told subsource that he had been declassified some time ago by his "A.T." headquarters. It was allegedly stated that HANS GODECK was fired by German officials in 1943 and that his Austrian citizenship was dubious. When asked by subsource, how he had been informed, KAUSCH first stated vaguely, but finally stated that he had been interrogated by Hans ALTMANN on sub ect. KAUSCH believes Hans GODECK to be the defaulter, and claims that General JORDAN might be interested in his case.

170 cm., slender, dark hair & eyes, cold, smooth complexion, approximately 46 years old, house type, Salstar address still unknown, probably of Kyröma origin.

SAB AND entered Austria on approximately 10 days ago after a transit via, coming from the Middle East (Aleppo) via Italy (SAB was in new overcoat with a Tunis trade mark). Their AUDER, his transit visa was extended by SAB's army police 'for health reasons'. At the Salzburg 'Bayerischer Hof' show, J. PFAFFO, a dancer by profession, noted in 'Sensationen fallen vom Himmel'. According to AUDER, J. PFAFFO intends to build up a gypsy dancers group for the West Mediterranean countries. Allegedly Miss Aufmuth has 'free' to such plan. Immediately upon J. PFAFFO's arrival at Salzburg, KAUDER told subsource that SAB AND had brought with him a considerable sum in gold coins. During the last days, AUDER vainly tried to pawn, with local 'Forotheum' and banks, for A3 15,000. a number of Mexican 50-pesos coins allegedly containing 37 grams of pure gold (minted in 1945/46). The coins were fixed in rings with clips; according to Austrian currency regulations such jewelry is considered coins and must be sold to Nationalbank. Therefore AUDER did not succeed.

On February 27, ANDER met Hans ALTMANN at a Graz hotel; present were Leo Lucius ALTMANN (brother of Hans ALTMANN), police Stadtkommandant of Vienna 7th district, Professor Josef MATL, professor for Clavie philology at Graz University, former Einsatzleiter with Abwehr, and Mrs. FELBER, wife of Graz Oberlandesgerichtsrat Dr. Anton FELBER (+).

(+) Comment: Dr. Anton FELBER presided the trial in the MANN case. MANN, a former top nazi, left to his wife (ANDER's longstanding friend) a house, which, according to anti-nazi law, was seized by the Austrian government. MANN's widow sued the state for restitution; she won her case in Linz. Vienna Supreme Court cancelled the decree and sent the case to Graz Oberlandesgericht for retrial. President of the Court was above FELBER, and Mrs. MANN won again. Vienna Supreme Court again requested the files, and the case is still pending for possible retrial by Vienna courts.
