REPORT OF PROGRESS</p> <p style="text-align: center;">MAR 16 1952</p> <p>On 18 March 1955 a personal letter from Richard KAUDER-KIATT, Schwaistrasse 7, Salzburg, and Galsburg, Austria, to Viktor Macellan, Schwaistrasse 7, Frankfurt am Main, Germany, was intercepted by the Civil Censorship Group (CCG) in Austria. The CCG intercept, in the English language, as received from COG, is retained in the files of this Sub-Detachment. A copy of the intercept is attached to each copy of this report as EXHIBIT 1. In this letter KAUDER-KIATT sympathized with Macellan, who had been suffering from a painful illness, and told him that he would have ample time to compose the music for the ballet, "even after three months hence". "However," he continued, "the situation is more involved in regard to the other business we have embarked on, for this cannot be simply interrupted or just abandoned." After having reached an agreement with Macellan to intensify business relations with him, SUBJECT had promised the settlement of an "expense account". "In such an extensive business with company known throughout the world," nobody would accept illness as an excuse for "stopping or interruption of the business". The "firm" would have to find "means to procure the necessary data for the continuance of the business", and notice of any cessation in operation should be given "in good time". Further, there was a point on which SUBJECT desired clarification. Macellan had written to SUBJECT that he intended going to London "prior to the operation", while in a letter of the same date to "Hugo" he had stated that he would "forego the trip to London". SUBJECT closed the letter expressing great excitement in awaiting Macellan's reply.</p> <p>Agent's Notes: Viktor (or Victor) Macellan is a alias of Victor Altmann. The "Hugo" mentioned above is probably Dr. Hugo Mittel, mentioned in numerous reports in the files of 480th CIC Sub-Detachment A as an associate of Richard KAUDER-KIATT.</p> <p>Agent Report, S-17806, dated 17 April 1955, Subject: "KAUDER-KIATT, Richard", reports that a letter from Victor Macellan to SUBJECT, which appears to be a reply to the letter reported above, was intercepted by CCG on 1 April 1955. In this letter Macellan stated "... I am not recovering from the illness.... I hesitated whether I am to wait here or go to London in order to undergo an operation and I now come to a decision. I will go to London and only will take care of some urgent business...here."</p> <p>On 28 April 1955 a telephone conversation between Richard KAUDER-KIATT and Victor Altmann was intercepted by CCG. the English language, as received from CCG, is retained in the files of this Sub-Detachment. A copy of the intercept is attached to each copy of this report as EXHIBIT II. SUBJECT, speaking from Rupertgasse 10, Erlsburg (the address of Hotel Rupertinof), asked Altmann, who was speaking from SUBJECT's office on Schwarzstrasse 30, Salzburg, about his health, and the letter replied that he was bandaged. Altmann stated that he desired to call on SUBJECT and requested directions, adding that he had his automobile with him. SUBJECT recommended that "Miss Anni from the office" ride with Altmann, and Altmann said that he would not stay long and could take Anni back again when he was finished.

On 16 May 1953 a personal letter postmarked Frankfurt am Main, Germany, from Victor Macellan to SUBJECT was intercepted by CCG. The CCG intercept, in the English language as received from CCG, is retained in the files of this Sub-Detachment. A copy of the intercept is attached to each copy of this report as EXHIBIT III. Macellan stated that he had returned "here" for a short time to liquidate his "local business interests", but would be henceforth "mostly in London" to transfer "my business there". He added that there are still "enormous possibilities in London to do business within the Commonwealth" and that he had "important business friends there" and "major orders for Austria in the field of steel and iron". Macellan stated that he would see SUBJECT in the near future when he would be passing through Salzburg on his way to Linz, Lower Austria, to see "the people of Umstal, producers of artificial jewelry, which we badly need for Africa." He ended by stating, "One of my old business friends will probably visit you early next month."

From 10 April to 30 April 1953 the mail and the telephone conversations of Richard KAUDER-ELATT, with offices at Schwarzstrasse 30, Salzburg, Land Salzburg, Austria, were intercepted by the Civil Censorship Group (CCG) in Austria, and the following eleven intercepts were felt to have some CI interest. The CCG intercepts, in the English language as received from CCG, are retained in the files of this Sub-Detachment. A copy of each intercept is attached to each copy of this

Agent's Notes: The name in the upper left hand corner of the intercept and the number 1 refer to the caller or the sender, the name in the upper right hand corner and the number 2 refer to the callee or the recipient.

EXHIBIT IV: This intercept is a telephone conversation which took place on 14 April 1963 at 1610 hours. SUBJECT told a woman called "Chery" in Grossgmain, Land Salzburg, Austria to come at 0820 hours 15 April without luggage. SUBJECT stated that his wife would go with him, and Chery said that she would go with her aunt. SUBJECT reassured Chery that there was "no reason to be afraid", and asked her "who are the members of the Rollex-Ballet?" Chery replied that "years ago" "Trude" and "Dolfi" had appeared in Italy under the name "Rollex-Ballet". SUBJECT said that if he had engaged the "Rollex-Ballet" he could have gotten rid of "them". Chery said that she had told "Dolfi" to call "Carlos" on "Monday evening". SUBJECT closed with "We will see each other tomorrow without chewing-gum."

EXHIBIT V: This intercept is a telephone conversation which took place on 16 April 1963 at 1613 hours; Dr. Foenisch in Salzburg told SUBJECT that a newspaper in East Berlin, printed in December 1962, mentioned an American agent named Keuder living in Frankfurt am Main in connection with the proceedings against Slarsky. SUBJECT denied being identical with the Keuder mentioned in the newspaper, and stated that he was in possession of a copy of the same newspaper.

Agent's Notes: "Slarsky" is probably identical with the former president of Czechoslovakia who was recently condemned to death by the Communist Party.

EXHIBIT VI: This intercept is a telephone conversation which took place on 20 April 1963 at 1150 hours. SUBJECT told Dr. Gehmacher, o/e Manfred Gehmacher, Salzburg, that "Nikola Toni" was in Salzburg and that he (SUBJECT) would have to wait for him after which he (SUBJECT) would go to see Gehmacher at (time undecipherable due to lack of clearence in translation, probably out o'clock). SUBJECT could not yet tell Gehmacher what he would bring, but that "now I will go to Berger and look at my matters". He promised to do his best to bring something.

Agent's Notes: The "Nikola Trui" mentioned in the above conversation is probably Dr. Franz Nikolaconi, frequently mentioned as a contact of SUBJECT.

EXHIBIT VII: This intercept is a letter, intercepted on 20 April 1953, with no return address but postmarked Budapest, addressed to SUBJECT, a person signed "Mother" sent birthday greetings to "Ibiki" and asked "Ibiki" why she had not communicated her new home address.

Agent's Notes: "Ibiki" is probably identical with SUBJECT's Hungarian wife, Ibola Kauder nee [unclear].

EXHIBIT VIII: This intercept is a telephone conversation which took place on 31 April 1953 at 1334 hours. SUBJECT ascertained from Dr. Zittel in Salzburg that the latter would be coming "tomorrow in the forenoon" at 0900 hours, adding that he (SUBJECT) was asked because he "would like to know the subject which will be discussed with Seeman," who desired to talk about "the citizenship and about the deposit". Zittel stated that if the relations between "Ibi" and Seeman were strained, it was because of Seeman's taunt. SUBJECT stated that he had received a letter from "Viktor" stating that he (Viktor) would arrive on the 27th or 28th, and that he had not received an answer from Seeman. Zittel stated that he had already written to "Viktor" and that he (SUBJECT) was just about to write [unclear].

Agent's Notes: "Ibi" is probably [unclear] and "Viktor" is probably identical with [unclear].

It is the opinion of [unclear] that the identification of speakers in the second part of the intercept (the words "I don't think so...") is incorrect due to a transcriptional error; i.e., the number "1" should read "2", and vice versa. This copy of EXHIBIT VIII has been written with this in mind.

EXHIBIT IX: This intercept is a telephone conversation which took place on 28 April 1953 at 0906 hours. SUBJECT asked an unidentified woman in Salzburg if "Huber" had a telephone, the woman replied that he had, and asked if anything were wrong. She stated that she was afraid that something was wrong, that she hoped everything was "all right with the business", and that she was always afraid when somebody telephoned, because "it may be something from the good old times". SUBJECT reassured [unclear].

her that he was calling on "a pure business matter", that Huber was to arrange something for SUBJECT. The woman replied, "He probably will go there. Perhaps he went to an authority."

PARAGRAPH 1: This intercept is a telephone conversation which took place on 22 April 1953 at 0917 hours; SUBJECT told an unidentified man at the Polizeidirektion, Churfuerststrasse 1, Salzburg, telephone 5581 extension 315, that the residence permit of Rakosch, a possessor of an Argentinian passport, was to expire on 24 April 1953, and that Rakosch would visit the Polizeidirektion to arrange the matter. The caller replied that he would talk to Graf, that it was unnecessary for SUBJECT to speak with Horst, and that Rakosch was to come to room 119. SUBJECT went on to say that one "Wischerl" had recovered from his sickness, and that he had written "Hugo" that "he" will come at the end of the month". SUBJECT then asked how much "he" was to pay, and the caller replied "thirty schillings".

Agent's notes: The "Wischerl" mentioned above may be identical with Viktor Altman alias Viktor Macellen. "Hugo" is probably identical with Dr. Hugo Mittel.

PARAGRAPH 11: This intercept is a telephone conversation which took place on 4 April 1953 at 1615 hours in the Romanian language; a Mr. Simon in Salzburg asked Mr. Marcel, care of SUBJECT, if there was any news. Marcel replied that he would not know for "half an hour", that he did not know what was the "matter with the goods", but that he would be able to tell about that "in half an hour", and that he (Marcel) was very anxious to learn what had happened.

PARAGRAPH 12: This intercept is a telephone conversation which took place on 5 April 1953 at 1025 hours, a woman named Hilde at Hotel Rupertshof informed SUBJECT that a package, bearing the declared value of 18 schillings, from the firm Neuhold in Graz, Land Styria, Austria, addressed to Hotel Rupertshof, had arrived, and that SUBJECT would have to pick it up in person and pay approximately 18 schillings. SUBJECT expressed ignorance concerning the identity of the firm Neuhold.

PARAGRAPH 13: This intercept is a telephone conversation which took place on 27 April 1953 at 1800 hours, an unidentified man in SUBJECT's office informed a man named Peter in Salzburg that he could only get "papers" from Hungary. Peter replied that that was out of the question.

EXHIBIT XIV: This intercept is a letter to SUBJECT from J. Emil Kalkus, Wein-Import-Export Kom., Alsterterrasse 8, Hamburg 30, Germany, dated 30 April 1953; Kalkus requested SUBJECT to remit immediately the 2,200 schillings which SUBJECT had told Dr. Mitsche that he would remit. Kalkus also stated that he would probably call on SUBJECT in June on his way to Bulgaria.

On 13 April 1953 telephone conversation between Richard KAUDER-KIATT, born 6 September 1900 in Vienna, Austria, with offices at Schwarzenstrasse 30, Salzburg, and Salzburg, Austria, and a man named "Lazi" was intercepted by the Civil Censorship Group (CCG), Salzburg. The CCG intercept, in the English language as received from CCG, is retained in the files of this Sub Detachment. A copy of the intercept is attached to each copy of this report as EXHIBIT XV. In EXHIBIT XV Lazi stated that nothing had happened and that he would come the following morning to discuss something "pleasant" with SUBJECT.

Agent's Notes: "Lazi" may be identical with Laci or Gerushka, who is commonly known as "Lazi" (phonetic). Gerushka is mentioned in numerous reports in the files of 430th CIC Sub-Detachment A as a personality connected with Eastern and Western European and Balkan States intelligence activities in the Salzburg area.

On 29 May 1953 the files of 430th CIC Sub-Detachment A were examined by this Agent and the following information was revealed:

Richard KAUDER-KIATT is mentioned in numerous reports in the files of this Sub-Detachment as a former German intelligence operative.

Ibela Hauder nee Halman is mentioned in numerous reports in the files of this Sub-Detachment as the wife of Richard HAUDER-KLATT.

Dr. Gehmacher is probably identical with Dr. Friedrich Gehmacher, mentioned in numerous reports as an associate of SUBJECT.

Dr. Frank Nikoladoni is mentioned in numerous reports as an associate of SUBJECT and as a Public Prosecutor in Linz, Land Upper Austria.

Viktor Altman alias Victor Macellan is mentioned in numerous reports as an alleged British intelligence operative and as a former British intelligence operative.

Rakosch is mentioned in numerous reports as a contact of SUBJECT and is probably identical with Josef or Jerry Rakos, born 4 June 1906, residing at Bergstrasse 17, Salzburg, mentioned in Agent Report, S-10041, dated 13 February 1953, Subject: HAUDER-KLATT, Richard, evaluated P-6, as a contact of SUBJECT and as a suspected Hungarian intelligence operative.

Dr. Hugo Kittel is mentioned in numerous reports as an associate of SUBJECT and is a former German intelligence officer.

J. Emil Kalkus is probably identical with Emil Kalkus, residing in Vienna IX, a wine merchant listed in a letter from the St. Gilgen Field Officer dated 19 December 1949, Subject: Proposed Penetration of Bulgaria and the USSR, as an individual who could be used as a cut out for a penetration net.
