SUBJECT: ALEXANDROW, Georgi

NSLA-4608, 12 June 1953

Subject was born 15 April 1897 in Petersburg, USSR. He is 5'8" tall, has oval face, blue eyes, blond hair, and is minus the thumb on his right hand. He worked in Russia as an electrical engineer and attended the FRUEZE in Moscow. He commanded the 61st Motorized, Mechanized Regiment of the 4th Infantry Division and was captured in 1943 by the Germans. At that time he was a colonel and from 1943 to 1945 he commanded the 3rd Regiment, 600th Vlassov Division for the Germans as a Lt. Col. From 1945 thru 1953 he worked as an electrician and radio technician for U. S. Engineers, Salzburg. He is unmarried and lives at Scherzhauer Feldsiedlung, Block L 2/11, bei RIEHER (?).

NSLA-4069, 12 June 1953

He is to be used in ZIPPER's REDCAP effort as a researcher and instructor.

NSLA-4128, 17 June 1953

Trace request on Subject, indicating he was removed by Americans in November, 1945, from a camp in Aibling and taken to Vienna and set to work looking for Soviet deserters. He wore an American uniform and remained in Vienna until March, 1946. Presumably, this was part of the clandestine Army policy of aiding and sheltering Soviet deserters in Austria.

NSLA-394, 25 November 1953

A 1951 memo shows a Georg ALEXANDROW, born 15 April 1897, St. Petersburg, Russia; last permanent address, Belgrade. Applied for emigration under the DP act in 1951. Then living at Scherzhauer Feldsiedlung, Block L 2/11, Salzburg. His destination in the U. S. was Indiana and his sponsor was Sam H. REED of Fort Belvoir, Va.

Also includes as trace in 2598C, 10 October 1945, Georg ALEXANDROW, born 13 January 1897, Leningrad, Russia; served White Russian Army until 1921, had rank of Major. In 1943 with Organization TJD, transferred to Vlassov army shortly before end of war.
