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b) Because there is a very strong distrust of the government among the Japanese public, any Government program will not be successful.

c) The distrust of the government is so deep that it will not be corrected in the present and in a near future, and the Government's efforts can not be corrected.

d) Therefore passing through the heavy Government program will simply induce their ill feeling against our conservative regime as well as against the United States.

e) This comes from the peculiar situation of Japan after the war and from the special psychology of the Japanese. Regardless whatever argument may be made, we have to face it as a fact.

f) Though the Japanese having an ability and a desire for the more prosperous nation, they are poor with a low income (e.g. the total annual income of the Japanese nation is about one-twentieth of that of the United States and the annual income per capita is only one-twentieth of that of the United States).

g) To give the poorest, we have to do something of social security, though we have yet done a few.
