SUBJECT: Letter to Mr. Okinori Kaya

1. This memorandum submits a letter for signature and return, subject to your approval.

2. The attached letter is a suggested reply to the letter (also attached) to you from Mr. Okinori Kaya of the Japanese House of Representatives, dated 27 July. [] Station has been queried as to their interest in resuming contact with Mr. Kaya and has replied affirmatively, requesting that the reply be pushed to them for delivery by Mr. [] as a means of establishing Mr. [] bona fides with Mr. Kaya. Mr. [] is an experienced staff employee case officer at [] Station.

3. We have included in the letter the request that it be returned to Mr. [] and shall, in transmitting the letter, instruct him to advise Mr. Kaya that it would be indiscreet for Mr. Kaya to retain the letter because of the adverse political repercussions which might occur if Socialist or other political enemies were to learn that he is in correspondence with CIA.

I am certain that you can make a real contribution to your country in that capacity, particularly now that our governments are considering revision of the Security Treaty.

I am taking the liberty of forwarding this letter to be delivered to you personally so that it will serve the additional purpose of introducing the bearer, Mr. [] to you as a representative of my organization. As I am most interested in learning your views both on international affairs affecting relations between our countries and on the situation within Japan, I hope that you will find time for discussion of these subjects with Mr. []. For reasons which Mr. [] will explain to you, I would appreciate your returning this letter to him after you have read it.
