Subject first contacted in the summer 1964, via introduction by [] in Tokyo, Japan. The purpose of the contact was to discuss more effective conservative political activities to counter left-wing movements in Japan.

By virtue of his political and social position, the Subject has no trouble on this account--he simply orders the information and/or the appearance of people that he wishes to contact.

The Subject definitely does not think he is working for us--he is aware that he is in contact with KUBARK.
