I. GREEKAL

In accordance with your request, a review of the operations of the KIRIN-II net is herewith forwarded for your consideration. The review was based on a thorough study of available files, answers to written questions which were submitted by the reviewer to both the case officers and the chief agent, special reports prepared by the chief agent for 5 the review, and a thorough interrogation of the chief agent and his I deputy by a polygraph examiner. The special written reports and written answers to questions were considered necessary as both the German and English files are inedequate-databled contact reports do not exist. The reviewer briefed the polygraph examiner in detail and provided him with a set of written questions for the interview with the chief agent. The six-hour interrogation of KIBITZ-IS by the examiner was monitored by the reviewer at the time of the interrogation.

INTENT AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT II.

- The EISIM-15 operation encompasses the development and establishment in Western Germany of a stay-bobind organization consisting of trained N/T operators, agents, cut-outs, and informants who could be activated in the event of hostilities. The component parts of the organization are to consist of separate teems including a T/T operator and other agents trained to report on conditions in energy territory. The agents are to be serviced by communications equipment and other incidental supplies which are to be cached.
- KICITI-15 was originally contacted by [コ·in August, 1950. C I's contact was a follow-up to a letter written by KIBITE-15 in May, 1950, to High Commissioner, McClay. In this letter, AIMIT-15 stated that he represented the interests of a group of former Reighauchr officers and offered to put his and his friends' services at the dis-

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commander the Americans. After several mentings, L. I are deted to MINITE-19 the establishment of a stay-behind organization. MINITE-19 did not like this idea in the beginning, and made it quite clear from the start that he and his friends were not suited for agent—byte activities and that there will never be an organized or effective resistance movement in dermany. He requested guarantees that he would always be from to take his place in a heat derman army or derman continuents of the purposan army and suggested that we use our influence to get him an appropriate position in the derman army as a remard for his services. He finally reluctantly agreed to set up of teams as any ested by us with the understanding that he would be in charge of organizing and controlling the not; he agreed to work with us but not for us.

- c. C I was the case officer for this project from August, 1950, until barch, 1952, when the project was turned over to I I'v. In December, 1962, K I was hospitalized and at the present time, E I is the case officer.
- d. EISTT-15 contacted approximately five hundred persons in Mestern Cornany to recruit sembers for his set. Of these five hundred, one hundred twenty-five were asked to participate in the stay-behind organization. These one hundred twenty-five were asked to take part in an organization which is ready to defend Western culture against Bolshevism. They were further told that this organization is led and trained by German of Lears who work closely with American authorities. The recruits were infersed that they would receive training and would be expected to report on certain activities when and if Germany should be exercise by the Soviets.
- Twelve two-men teams and one singleton team have now been set up. All teams have one V/T operator trained by KUBARK communications personnel. The training of only two of the V/T operators has been consisted.

 In the other cases, the derived of training varies from assessment for I/T training to three-quarter completion of the V/T training course.

 In addition, the teams have received so-called tectical training from KIBITZ-15. According to KIBITZ-15, tactical training means training in methodology of report writing and certain instructions about tectical movements of troups. In addition to the twenty-five members who have been navigned to teams, the net has thirty-eight active agents who could be made available for V/T training if and when they receive a security clearages.
- f. With the exception of the colef agent, all other agents carry out their assigned duties on a voluntary part-time basis. The chief agent gets a calary of RM 1,000.00 per month plus reimburement for expenses incurred in running the not. Other agents are only paid while they

- b. The case officers presented themselves as U.S. government officials under direct control of "solington and connected with military planning for MATO and the European army. The last interrogation indicated, however, that KIBITS-15 knows that he is working for KUBAKK.
- c. FIRIT-IS knows a total of nine safe houses of mich six are no longer in use. All these safe houses are U.C. requisitioned properties. Two of the original safe houses are sino known to other kinITZ agents who are not connected with the KIRITZ-IS net. The house at Unterschönderf, Davaria, which we used until September, 1972, was originally used by CIC and leter by D. Jas a billet. C. I so now a member of Fullach.

that he possesses five or six tistols and one sub-machine run. Then

- f. Dering the Interrogation, AISITY-15 stated that he carries the names of all newbers of his not with him he his typewriter. The security implication of this action needs little amplification.

These plans eare sown to a few of the members of the net out according to ELEITHIS all copies are elser in his own opposition or in the safe which is used by both ELEITHIS and our start officers in the Heidelberg office. These plans were simeographed a year and a half ago and it is impossible to establish at this time exactly how many copies were produced. ELEITHIS did admit during the interrogation that he had seem in his house which, of course, is a scrious security risk.
- h. It aspears highly likely that two of the so-called "63" active agents who have been recruited but not trained are also part of the FISSER field organization. (Pull 473h)
- i. Himmi-it is a salesman for a tractor company and part owner in a farm machinery firm and a general sules store. Although it is not believed that any of these positions are very remunerative, they appear to be adequate as personal cover when taken together with the last that he is quite active in veterans affairs. According to him, there have been no difficulties in connection with his cover and he believes that it is accepted by most veterans with whom he is associated and by the Sermen government. KIBITA-15 states that he has never informed anybody in the German government about the existence of the organization. He further believes that they do not know anything about its existence. The German government and perticularly members of the Blank office with whom he has excellent personal connections, know that he is in constant contact with former officers, who were connected with him during the war, but they supposedly do not know anything about the true purpose of this connection. This question was soxed repeatedly during the interview and the carriage test, and the examiner believes that KINITI-15 told the trath.

j. Elel 17-150, who is Els I 12-15's docuty, is the manager of a coverty samulacturing company. This cover seems, covever, to have verious security accepts. According to KLSIT-15, the company is constantly operating on the verge of illegality because it produces accome

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figurines. XIRIT -15 agrees that this cover will have to be changed.

- k. During the interrogation and in answer to a written question, EIBITV-15 has admitted that he discussed his aim of "protecting Europe" with a member of German industry in the foring of 1991. EIBITX-15 refuses to give the name of the person with whom he discussed the plans.

 FIBITY-15 states that the discussion was in general terms and was for the numpose of soliciting support and finding out what responsible Germans thought of his ideas. According to EIBITY-15, nobody was told that he receives American support. The contact with German industry was supposedly dropped shortly after the initial meeting with the information that EIBITX-15 felt that his plans were too cumbersome and could not be realized.
- 1. NIMIT-13 appears to have very little understanding of the necessity of a securely compartmentalized organization. He has unnecessarily close personal ties with some members of the organization and there is a strong possibility that he tried to solicit our financial support for some members of the net for strictly personal ressons.
- In 1951, the case officer and the chief agent decided to set up a notional cover organisation. This notional organization was supposed to be a news service which was called "Cosmopress". Stationary giving the name Cosmorress was printed. The location of this agency was the Heidelberg safe house at Rohrbacherstrasse 56. In addition, Cosmopress had a post office box in Stuttgart. No activities were carried out to strengthen this cover and to give the appearance that Cosmopress was in fact a news service. KIBITZ-15 states that his cover organization never had any contact with the bonafide news service that carries the sems name and operates in West Germany. Communications with four agents; assely, 177, 182, 191 and 171 were carried out on Cosmopress stationery. Correspondence with the investigating bureaus was also carried out on behalf of Cosmopress. A Volkswagen nurchased by us was legally registered by XIRIT2-150 as a Cosmopress vehicle. The vehicle was used by KIBITZ-171, a German a/T instructor who has now been dropped. Since June, 1952, the car has been used by EIBITE-150. F I had a number of press passes printed for Cosmopress. As far as can be accertained at this time, only one pass is still in circulation. The cover of the Cosmopress service was discombinued with the derequisitioning of the sefe house in Getober, 1987. Since this cover arrangement was completely inadequate, it must be considered a definite security risk, particularly since a Cosmopress agency does in fact exist.
- n. KE 177-171 was a F/T imstructor for the net from October, 1951, until June, 1862. In the performance of his assigned duties, he came into contact with sixteen members of the net and thereby yot an excellent

insight into the operation. This partied APCITI-15 particularly since AT INV-171 did not appear to be very reliable and was in constant mod of funds. The Servan files Indicate that (1971-171 has threatened MIDITI-15 and us with court action. In his correspondence with APCITI-171, APCITI-15 makes it a pear that he would have continued the caployment of APCITI-171 but that his sponeous (the U.C. government) are against such action. In the course of the interrogation, APCITI-15 stated repeatedly that APCITI-171 has to be taken out of Germany. APCITI-171 represents a serious accurity risk to this operation and it is not at all certain that this risk will be considerably administed by relocating him. He has now been turned over to HAMVA I for processing 4th the moment, he does not wish to emigrate and prefers to stay in Germany particularly since we pay him IN-171.00 a month without reducating a quid pro quo.

o. In addition to MISITZ-171, at least ten (136, 155, 185, 190, 197, 158, 162, 165, 166, 178) other former members of the net have severed their connection with the organization or were dropped for various reasons. Three of the ten were dropped because of their close connection with EXRITZ-171. Five of the persons dropped have had some V/T training. Every person that has received E/T training has not at least one or two MESAMA staff officers and knows the location of a safe house.

IV. AMALYSED OF SHOURCE

a. KIBITE-IS

- (1) RIBIE-15 is a very ambitious, conceited Serman officer, who still believes in many of the doctrines execunded by actional socialist philosophers and propagandists. He appears to be extremely intelligent and energetic. It is believed that his agreement to work with us was based mainly on the following three considerations:
 - A. His dislike of civilian pursuits,
 - 3. The possibility that he might get the position of a Colonel or Brigadier General in the German army or European army through our influence as a reward for his work,
 - t. That the fight of the white races against the colored races can only be wen with american aid. (KINIT-IS believes that the structle against Communium is bairly a light between the white and the colored races.)

110177-15 is an extreme Berber nationalist and certainly not pro-American. We to willing to accept financial support from us

at this time as it helps to promote ideas and plans in which he personally believes. Although he is definitely anti-Communist, he presents somewhat of a security risk because of this pronounced nationalism.

- (2) Since the beginning of 1952, KIBITZ-LEPhas been warried considerable about his own personal status. From the available agendate of meetings between case officers and the chief agent, it would appear that this subject was taken up at almost every meeting since April, 1952. Unfortunately, it was impossible to reconstruct just exactly what was discussed because of the absence of detailed contact reports. KIBITZ-LEF was thoroughly questioned on this point in the course of the interview. KIBITZ-LEF requests definite answers to the following three points:
 - A. Establishment of a platform which will define the legal nosition of his organisation vis a vis Bonn, NATO and the European army,
 - B. Arrangements between U.S. authorities and the Fonn government to legalize the services of RIBITY-15.
 - C. Pormulation of a definite mission for the organization during peace time and in the event of mar.

KILITZ-15 explained in great detail that es a former German soldier he is absolutely anwilling to undertake any activities which might be contrary to German law. (However, he does not worry about the meapons which he possesses.) He does not feel that his present activities are illegal and arrives at this conclusion with the peculiar reasoning that the German roverment is not permitted activities of the type in which he is engaged and, therefore, they also can not prohibit them. In the same vein. he explains that he is in general opposed to Partisan activities and that neither he nor his group are willing to work as American agents. He has expressed the idea in writing that as presently constituted, his group might well get the protection of the Hagus Convention in the event of hostilities. He has agreed to the concopt that at present the existence of his net must be kept secret. however, he feels that at a later date German general of dicers might be informed about its existence and particularly its Teadermhip.

As far as makin errangements for his services is concerned, he cited the example that Aussolini was able to request specific German officers during the last was for special assignments.

KIBITZ-LI suggested that similarly, General Sedell Smith could request KIBITZ-LI from the German government. He added that of course his status of a Colonel in the Servan army would have to

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be continued d ning die assi ment.

- (3) in a short yearly report, Al. FR-15 grants out that during the last year. his work has stagmated consistely and that nothing has been accomplished whice L I took over from L I in March. 1952. The main reason for this stagnstion is our inability to clear in the statue question which was explained above. In addition, KIRTY-15 feels that the question of responsibility has not been estilled and that our bureaucratic methods and the divideal distance make close comparation with the Americans impossible. A successful solution to the responsibility question would mean to HIMIN-15 that he is not in complete charge of the organization. He feels that he should only be requested to report from time to time to a superior on his progress. With the solution of this problem, the difficulty susposedly arising out of our bureaucratic behavior would venish as it would no longer be necessary for RIBITE-15 to comply with detailed instructions and particularly no further MC's would have to be submitted. The J and C Is seems to stem mainly from animosity to [the fact that they requested him to achere to a very few basic administrative requirements. The main one being the clearing of personnel prior to training them as %/I operators. MINITY-15 considers this unmacedeary as he feels that he knows Germans well enough to decide who is a Communist agent and who is not. On the other hand, KIBITZ-15 has seriously jeopardised the security of the operation by submitting names of members of the net to Oerman investigating apareles.
 - (1) KIRITZ-15 has from the beginning refused to become an American agent and as far as he is concerned, he does not hold such a position at this time. For this reason, he has also refused to sign a contract which would gut our relationship on a regular basis. Instead, KIRITZ-15 has drawn up a contract of his own which does not only specify his duties but also our responsibility towards him. The interesting features of this contract are:
 - A. That as soon as a German army is roustablished, MIBITE-15 would be paid a salary which is equivalent to that said to a Colonel in the German army,
 - B. The requirement that FIBITT-15 would never be asked to undertake any activities which would be in violation of Jarman law or would conflict with his responsibilities as a German citizen,
 - C. The requirement that we find a critable assignment for him in the future German army and if this should not be possible because such an Army has not been established or is not secure,

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we would agree to the distilliant an appropriate orivate or government too after the expiration of the contract.

(5) KIBITY-11 has had apple experience in the Gorman army but none of it appears to have been in the clandestine field. He had no experience in setting up a 1/2 but when we contacted him two years ago. In spite of this, he has hardly ever accepted the guidance of the case officer. There has certainly never been any control whatever over EI-127-15 and his activities on our behalf. Listening to KEBITE-15's characterization of the various case officers who have been consected with this project, it appears that he divides them roughly into two catagories; namely, those that tried to control or influence him, and those that let him run the show on his own terms. He only seems to like those case officers that correct him complete freedom of action. The review of his operations clearly indicates, however, that KIBITZ-15 is definitely in newd of guidance as he is quite naive and ignorant about some aspects of setting up a claudestine stay-behind organization. He stated, for instance, that one of the main reasons why his organization could never be uncovered is the fact that it does not have a name. Certain passages in his written plane on W/T stay-behind activities which were to be issued to individual terms show similar naivate and verboalty. On the other hand, bacic written information on his present organization is almost explicitly lacking. He also seems to have iven little, if any, thought to the two important problems of compartmentalization and staysbility. He seems to have close personal ties to many members of his net and it is hard to fight the feeling that one of the arcuts (182) was hired only because she is his girl friend. He has also not considered it below himself to request DM 3,000 for her so that she could be set up in an apartment and be given secretorial training in Mesbaden.

b. The Elding-15 not:

- (1) As pointed out above, approximately one hundred twenty-five agents have been recreited for this set. A month ago, MISITE-15 was ordered to decrease the number of agents. The case officer and the chief agent have now agreed to keep sixty-three active agents. Mineteen of these sixty-three agents have required full security clearance from Washington. Clearance requests have only been subsitted for three additional agents.
- (2) KIBITZ-15 has not really iven his consent to a cut in the number of agents. He still feels that he should be permitted to set up teams all over lestern Cormany and still comes up with the number of one hundred fifty teams. His whole concent of operations differs considerably from ours. He does not be love very strongly in the security measures which we consider essential but rather feels that the loss of bests which will occur during war time can best be overcome by starting out with the largest possible number in the beginning he will be most han y to start with more than

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one hundred fifty. This concert is undoubtedly to a home measure the result of his personal ambitions, which the interrogation, he intimated that he alone would like to be responsible for setting up h/T mets in rest dermany. He stated must unequivocally that he will not agree to continue his resignment if we do not increase the present scope of the proparion beyond the existing thirteen teams.

(3) Twenty-five of these active agents have now been assigned to teams. Our records and those suimitted by MSITZ-15 in answer to a written question do not exactly agree on the composition of these temas. However, since his information is more up-to-date and since he appears to be running this operation, his statements form the basis of this short analysis. On three of the twenty-five persons who are supposedly assigned to teams, we do not have any information at all. Ten of the persons have not received security clearances.

The 3/T operators of eleven tesms were soldiers, most of whom fought on the Eastern front against Russia. One W/T operator is a housewife and one a disabled soldier. The average are of the operators is thirty-seven. Little or no consideration seems to have been diven to the occupation of the erson who was accepted for W/T training. Obviously the stayability of a thirty-seven year old person during times of war is not very good unless he holds an essential job. Moreover, we have trained young men who were only themty-seven or twomty-eight (KIBITZ-198, 192) years old. To make matters worse, these two and KIDITE-199 work for muraburg Military Cost. This seems hardly the right occupation for a %/T stay-behind man. These three overators form the nuclei for three teams although they also know each other. Similarly, it is extremely hard to understand why KIRITZ-177 was ever selected for W/T training. AINITZ-177 is a thirty-seven year old waiter, a refuse from Last Germany. Thile in East Jermany, he was a member of OTLINEA. He took part in the Cranish Civil War as a member of the German army contingent. A person with this background we ld appear to have little stayability. In spite of this, EULIV-15 has asked us to loan FIBITZ-177 DE 7,000.00 so that he can buy a small hotel.

(h) The background of the team members is enumerated on Chart I. Chart II shows who knows sho in the teams. The information on Chart II is based on written statements by KIMIT-15 and C EMBITY-15 has been most reluctant to supply the reviewer with exact information and it must be presumed that even more members know each other than is indicated on the chart. As pointed out above, very little thought has been given by the chief agent to compartmentation or stayability aspects of setting up a stay-

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behind organization. Only in the last few rouths has the event received gridance on these problems. There is no indication in the files that the obising event ever received adequate instruction or guidance on the setting of a stay-behind organization. The reviewer does not feel that the teams as now constituted represent a valuable asset for stay-behind activities; they do not have stayability nor is the organization properly compartmentalized.

V. HECOMELEDATION

It is recommended that this operation be discontinued as soon as possible. The operation has not been securely conducted nor have we had any control or large measure of influence over the chief agent.

It is obviously the function of an Intelligence Agency to set up W/T stay-behind nots, but this has to be done in a professional manner. It might be possible to develop the services of ETHITE-150 for future operations in the stay-behind field. He seems to be more amonable than his chief to American guidance and would probably be willing to work for us as an agent. He could be entrusted to establish six new secure twoman teams. We can, however, only approach ETHIT-150 after we have arranged an acceptable job for KIBITE-15. MIBITE-15's talent as an organizer could be put to good use by letting him set up a not in the East Zone. An approach to KIBITE-15 should, however, only be made if we have a suitable senior case of licer who will be able to direct KIBITE-15's activities.
