- A. During the review period, seven issues, totalling 182,500 copies of the newspaper, Deutsche Soldaten Zeitung, were printed and distributed in Western Germany. These issues carried articles on the remilitarization in the Soviet Zone, a review of Sir Oswald Mosley's book The Urgent Resolution, the Japanese peace treaty, a series on the German navy in the Second World War, and other articles of military interest. The German Red Cross, in connection with the Deutsche Soldaten Zeitung, is leading a campaign in an attempt to locate German POWs still unaccounted for in the Soviet Union. In support of this campaign the DSZ has carried lists of missing POWs in their last three issues.
- B. Substantial interest is being shown in this new German military newspaper as evidenced by letters received from British, Irish, French, and Italian military journals. Furthermore, the DSZ has been tentatively chosen as the official newspaper of the newly formed German military roof organization, Verband Deutscher Soldaten, led by ex-General Friessner. Should this prove to be the organization's official organ, an intimate liaison and knowledge of the organization would be given to OPC.
