10. FACTS, EVALUATION AND COMMENT: (Use additional plain sheet if necessary)

a. (1) **Objective:** This project is designed to combat overt and covert opposition to West German integration into the defense of Europe by initiating appropriate action against the chief sources of dissension, viz, a) Communist fronts; b) the SPD; c) certain elements of the German Evangelical Church; d) extreme rightist groups; e) some tactics of the Bonn government coalition. Project KMMANLY was approved on 27 February 1951.

(2) During the reporting period, four issues, totaling 126,000 copies, of the weekly newspaper, Deutsche Soldaten Zeitung, were printed and sold or distributed in Western Germany. Approximately 10,000 of these were sold or distributed in Austria. At OPC request, the 30 August issue carried an article on the tragedy of German POW's still held in Russia, and this theme has received treatment in each of the subsequent issues. A special insert in the 14 September issue was specifically directed toward members of the former German Afrika Korps. In cooperation with the German Red Cross campaign to locate German POW's still unaccounted for in the Soviet Union, the DSZ has continued to carry lists of those missing.

b. (1). The DSZ carries just enough anti-western sentiment (largely concerned with German equality of rights) to hide the United States interest in it. Numerous groups of publishers or would-be publishers have attempted to purchase the paper or a part of it in order to gain controlling interest. This seems to indicate that the DSZ has established itself as an outstanding publication speaking for the former German soldier in Germany today.

(2) After the founding of the roof organization of all veterans' groups in Germany, attempts have been made by various interested groups to obtain the publishing rights for its news organ. A meeting held in Bonn on 20 September produced only inconclusive results, but tentative approval was given to a representative of the DSZ to draw up a contract. Pressure is being exerted by various groups, some possibly supported by the Bonn government, on the executive committee of the new organization for the consideration of other publications as the official organ.
